**<u>CYO CROSS COUNTRY 2005</u>** There's still time to sign up for CYO Cross Country – boys and girls in grades K through 8. There are sign up forms in the school office, or you can get one from me. Forms and payments must be turned in for meet participation. If you are playing soccer during practice times, that's OK. You just need to make sure you can make the meets. There are three meets, all held at Woodland Park. The two prelim meets are on Sunday September 18, and Sunday October 2, both at 1PM. The Championship meet is Sunday October 9 at 1PM. I'll provide more information closer to the meets. The race distances are 1/2 mile for K-3, 1 mile for grades 4 and 5, 1 1/2 miles for grades 6 and 7 and 2 miles for 8<sup>th</sup> graders. The cost is \$10 per participant. We will practice 3 days per week at Lincoln Park. We meet at the far north entrance to the park (at the paved service road) just behind and to the north of the Texaco station. Practices will start on Thursday, September 8<sup>th</sup>: Tuesdays and Thursdays at 4:00PM Saturdays (optional) at 8:30am. In response to growing pressure on parish assets, we made the decision this summer that good stewardship demanded that we find some way to cut expenses. After careful consideration, we decided our only option was to cut the position of Pastoral Assistant for Parish Involvement. It is with a heavy heart that I tell you this means Davi Sobotta will no longer be part of the parish staff. Davi has been a part-time staff member and an active member of this community almost since the time she came into the church at the Easter Vigil in 1996. Although her most recent official title was P.A for Parish Involvement, because of her talents and creativity and her expertise in the field of hospitality, we thought of her as the "Martha Stewart of Holy Rosary." Losing Davi will certainly change the face of our parish celebrations. It means we will need many new volunteers to step up

to help fill the gap and that volunteers already in place will be required to operate more autonomously. Davi will continue as one of our wedding coordinators and has agreed to be contracted for special events as her schedule and our budget allow. Davi, we offer thanks and appreciation for your dedication, your vision, the traditions you have helped us establish, and your many years of service.
