2005-06 HOLY ROSARY CHILDREN'S CHOIR. *TUESDAY* PRACTICES THIS YEAR. Who will lead the music in church when we_re all much older? How will they know what to do? What songs will they sing? The Holy Rosary Children_s Choir is an integral part of our parish music ministry, helping our school and parish students learn how to lead the music at mass. What they learn as children will provide them a solid foundation as they grow to become our future music ministry leaders! Students in grades 2-8 are eligible to participate (reading age). Practices are on TUESDAY from 3:15-4:15, beginning October 11, 2005 and going through May 9, 2006. The Children_s Choir sings at a parish mass about once a month, including Christmas and Easter! Older students learn how to cantor and sing harmony! Parents can help out and earn school volunteer hours. Choir try-outs and orientation will be Tuesday, October 4 at 3:15 in the church. SCRIP SALES. Our first bi-weekly FCE sale was pretty successful – 23 families (out of 330+) participated, purchasing \$5,100 worth of groceries – that's \$255 (5%) profit for our school!!! If all of us at HRS purchased \$200 of grocery gift cards each month thru SCRIP @ 330 families it would equal \$66,000 of groceries/month. 5% (profit for HRS) x \$66,000 = \$3,300.00 possible profit in one month for HRS!!! And this is just groceries! Add on your gas from Safeway, daily jolt from Starbucks, home repair items from Home Depot, furniture purchases from Macy's, winter wardrobe from Old Navy, yummy eats from Taqueria Guaymas, wonderful treats from Great Harvest, great reads from Barnes & Noble, latest releases from Hollywood Video, date nights at Regal Cinemas, etc. – one can only imagine how much our school could make!!! We have the SCRIP in stock – please stop by our Daily/Sunday table for ALL your shopping needs.

eScrip. Have you registered your Safeway Club card yet? If so, how about your family/friends/neighbors/co-workers? It's very easy. To register, go to www.escrip.com. Make sure you use our school's ID #8563292. Once registered, your purchases will be tracked thru eScrip and our school will earn up to 8% of your purchases!!! You can even use your favorite credit card for payment (though we would LOVE IT if you would purchase gift cards thru SCRIP – an extra 5% for our school!).

SAFEWAY 10% BACK TO SCHOOLS. If you are enrolled in eScrip, all purchases thru 9/6 of participating products marked with a yellow school bus will be automatically donated to your school. If you are NOT ENROLLED in eSCRIP, check your receipt the first time you shop at Safeway after September 6th. It will have a Rewards Certificate on the back with a Redemption Code and your total contribution amount. Please send this Rewards Certificate to school before October 11th. The SCRIP team will take care of it from there. Thanks to everyone who has already sent theirs in – we're hoping for some big \$\$\$ for HRS.
