PARENT / STUDENT / TEACHER / CONFERENCES are scheduled for the week of Oct. 25-28. Specific days and times are listed on the enclosed form. **Please read through the form carefully, complete it, and <u>return to the office no later than next Tuesday, October 4.</u> The staff will be scheduling conferences on Wednesday, Oct. 5, so it is necessary that we have all the forms back at that time. Thank you for your prompt attention to this. The schedule for conference week is as follows: Monday, Oct. 24 – full day of school; Tuesday, Oct. 25 – 2:15 dismissal; Wednesday, Oct. 26-Friday, Oct. 28 – no classes held, due to conferences. BASE will be open on all days that school is not in session. Students in grades 1-8 are required to attend conferences with their teachers.**

<u>SCRIP SALES.</u> Our next bi-weekly FCE SCRIP processing day is Monday, October 3rd. The enclosed order form consists of limited denominations of groceries. All orders MUST be turned into the school office by 9:00am, Monday to be processed that day. Our SCRIP office team only processes on Mondays, every other week – this is the only time that we are in the SCRIP office and/or check the SCRIP box in the school office. If your order comes in after 9:00am on the processing Monday, we will either send your <u>UN</u>processed order back to you in that week's FCE

or hold onto it until the following process day (10/17) – just depends when we happen to stop by the school office. Please remember, all other SCRIP purchases are made thru our Daily/Sunday sales table – please do not send the Daily/Sunday order form thru the school office – these purchases must go thru the SCRIP sales table. The SCRIP Daily/Sunday sales hours are M-F, 8:00-8:45am in the school hall entrance or after mass on Sundays when there is coffee & donuts scheduled.

eScrip. Have you registered your Safeway Club card yet? If so, how about your family/friends/neighbors/co-workers? It's very easy. To register, go to <u>www.escrip.com</u>. Make sure you use our school's ID #8563292. Once registered, your purchases will be tracked thru eScrip and our school will earn up to 8% of your purchases!!! You can even use your favorite credit card for payment (though we would LOVE IT if you would purchase gift cards thru SCRIP – an extra 5% for our school!).

LAST CALL - SAFEWAY 10% BACK TO SCHOOLS. If you are enrolled in eScrip, all purchases thru 9/6 of participating products marked with a yellow school bus will be automatically donated to your school. If you are **NOT ENROLLED IN eSCRIP**, check your receipt the first time you shop at Safeway after September 6th.
