\$1,876 RAISED FOR OUR TWIN SCHOOL, ST. ELIZABETH ANN SETON Our "Free Dress for A Dollar" donation day last week netted \$1,876 for St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, a Catholic elementary school in Kenner, Louisiana, that Holy Rosary School is helping to rebuild. Principal Joan Danos said that every school family was evacuated to various locations out-of-state before being able to return to the heavily damaged school on October 3rd. Seven teachers and numerous school families lost their homes. Seventy-seven families and three classroom teachers have not returned at all. St. Elizabeth Ann Seton has taken in a number of families unable to pay tuition, including three families who lost everything. The SEAS parish will not be able to reopen for at least another month. Our Holy Rosary student body prays one prayer from the Rosary each morning for our "twin" school. Look for more information about our involvement with St. Elizabeth Ann Seton in the coming weeks.

TRAFFIC FLOW PATTERN REMINDER. The Safety Committee has seen and received MULTIPLE reports of HRS families entering Dakota from California Avenue and traveling eastbound during drop off and pick up. This is in direct violation of the HRS traffic flow pattern. When families break this rule then all the families who are following the rules end up yielding to the "rule breakers". Families who are coming up to 42nd to the traffic circle are also forced to yield to the "rule breakers" going eastbound because there are cars entering the alley correctly. This

totally jams up the traffic flow and irritates those people who follow the rules. Please, please STOP going eastbound on Dakota during drop off and pick up. It is an expectation of HRS families to follow the HRS traffic flow pattern. Thank you, The HRS Traffic Flow Safety Committee
