<u>A MESSAGE FROM THE ENDOWMENT BOARD</u> The Endowment Board would like to let you know how the Father James Mallahan Endowment Fund has faired this school year. It has had \$18,895 in contributions from the school and parish since July of 2005. The golf tournament, at present our largest fundraiser for the Endowment, contributed \$10,003. As of April 30th, the value of the Endowment was \$1,113,319.97!!! At the end of June the Endowment will have contributed \$37,500 to the school's operating budget, to be slotted for tuition assistance. Thank you for your continued support to this long term investment for the perpetuity of Holy Rosary School. This is just one tool to help keep tuition down! Thank you from The Endowment Board.
