CYO CROSS COUNTRY 2006. There's still time to sign up for CYO Cross Country – boys and girls in grades K-8. There are sign-up forms in the school office, or you can get one from me. There are three meets, all held at Woodland Park. The two prelim meets are on Sunday September 17, and Sunday October 1, both at 1PM. The Championship meet is Sunday October 8 at 1PM. I'll provide more information closer to the meets. The race distances are 1/2 mile for K-3, 1 mile for grades 4 and 5, 1 1/2 miles for grades 6 and 7 and 2 miles for 8th graders. The cost is \$10 per participant. We will practice 3 days per week at Lincoln Park. We meet at the far north entrance to the park (at the paved service road) just behind and to the north of the 76 gas station. Practices will start on Thursday, September 7th: Tuesdays and Thursdays at: 00pm, Saturdays (optional) at 8:30am. Practice is 45 minutes to an hour (10 -15 minutes stretching and a 30 minute run). With a wide range of ages in our participants, we need parents to run with us so that the kids are within sight at all times.
