REGISTRATION PAPERS for next year are enclosed in this FCE. As mentioned in previous FCE's, your registration papers are withheld if you are not current with tuition, band, tithing, sacrificial giving card, auction procurement or parent commitment hours. Questions please call Miyuki at the school for tuition and band payments, Mary Simpson at the rectory for tithing and sacrificial giving cards, Ann Martin for auction procurement, and Karen Robel or Kelley Porter about parent commitment hours. (Just a reminder that tithing is calculated from June 2006.)

A NOTE FROM THE RECTORY There seems to be some confusion regarding the requirement that school families have a sacrificial giving card on file with the parish in order to be eligible for inparish tuition. Sacrificial Giving cards are sent out in November each year, and the commitment is for a calendar (not a school) year. A new card needs to be completed each year, even if you are on an automatic payment plan. We hope that you will prayerfully consider each year what your commitment will be.
