However, I realize that everything we do and celebrate is worthwhile. Last evening at Kennedy High School, our HRS School Band, along with bands from eight other Catholic elementary schools, participated in the Elementary Band Festival. Wow! What a fabulous concert! Each year at this festival two eighth grade students who will be attending Kennedy High School next year are selected to receive a special scholarship. Congratulations to **Sam Payne**, who was one of the scholarship recipients this year. Sam is the first Holy Rosary student to receive this honor! Tonight the final Parents' Club meeting of the school year takes place. This meeting is really an appreciation party to honor all of our committee chairs and outgoing officers. On Wednesday, May 23, Cole and Kyle Fehlen will be principal and vice principal for the day – thanks to their parents who purchased this at last year's auction. Cole and Kyle have chosen "Dress in Something to Embarrass Yourself" as the theme for the day. We ask parents to check that your children do dress appropriately and modestly in trying to embarrass themselves! Wednesday, the 23rd, is also the last 8th grade pizza lunch day. Next Friday, May 25, is our Field Day, which will be at Hiawatha. Every class will be selecting a color to wear for Field Day. Class colors will be posted on our website by Monday, May 21. A reminder that May 25 is a noon dismissal day due to the three day weekend – no school on Monday, May 28, Memorial Day. As always, thank you for your continued support to the teachers during this very busy time. Amidst all the fun there is still much learning and studying that needs to happen.
