**DEVELOPMENT NEWS:** As the Development Committee Chair, I wanted to communicate the purpose of our development efforts here at Holy Rosary, while our development office is "developing." The Development Office exists to raise funds and other resources to support the academic, capital and endowment needs of the school. This is done through the Annual Fund Drive, the cornerstone of yearly giving, and other special events. Donations to Holy Rosary make a difference in so many ways and in so many lives. Each of our alums has benefited from the

generosity of the generations that went before it, and through our continued fund raising efforts, many more generations will benefit as well. Donations to the Annual Fund support our general operating budget and allow us to keep up with inflation, pay our faculty and staff just wages, maintain the facility, meet the challenges of technology and most importantly, provide this education to all who desire. Charitable gifts to Holy Rosary, via the Annual Fund and/or the Endowment Fund, are wise investments in the current and future education of our children and our community. Gifts to the Annual Fund can be made at any time, although pledges are appreciated by December 31st of each year. Our fiscal year runs from July 1 through June 30, therefore all gifts pledged throughout the 2007-2008 school year are due by June 30, 2008. All gifts are tax-deductible to the extent provided by law. The Annual Fund has benefited from matching gift amounts from businesses that have such a program. A matching fund program could more than double your total gift to Holy Rosary. Please check with your Human Resources department to see if they have such a program. Over the next few weeks, and throughout the school year, I will provide an update as to the status of our fundraising efforts.
