Spring is such a busy time at Holy Rosary! Fifth graders are enjoying three days of environmental education at Camp Seymour this week. Fr. John and I look forward to visiting the campers later this afternoon. Our sixth graders will sail the seas of Puget Sound for three days next week and the following week. On Monday of next week, the eighth graders will travel to Olympia to learn more about how our state government operates and the third graders will enjoy visiting the Pacific Science Center. And later in the month our second graders travel to Eatonville to spend a day at the Pioneer Farm Museum. SCHOOL HEALTH UPDATE. Wellness, health and nutrition for school aged children have been a topic of discussion in the media as of late. Children in the United States are becoming overweight and obese, putting them at risk for many serious health concerns such as diabetes, cardiovascular disease, and elevated cholesterol and blood pressure. The present and future health and well-being of school-age children are profoundly affected by dietary intake. Schools contribute to current and life-long health and dietary patterns and are uniquely positioned to model and reinforce healthful eating behaviors in partnership with parents, teachers, and the broader community. In response to the above, and the call to action by federal, state and local governments, the Holy Rosary School Health and Wellness Committee has begun an assessment of the nutritional standards and practices at our school. In order to do so, the committee needs your help. A survey will soon be available on the school website. The committee is asking that you give us a few minutes of your time to provide us with your opinions and insight. Your participation will provide very valuable information and assist in the appraisal of the nutritional "health" of our school as well as provide a forum for you to share any concerns your family may have on the topic.
