Our theme this year is "Better Together" and I believe that is so fitting here at Holy Rosary. I am immensely grateful for the spirit of support and togetherness that exists here at every level. In this vein, I look forward to another exciting year of growth and new learning.

What can we do to help our children make a smooth transition from the more carefree days of summer to the more structured life of school? Here are three tips for helping your children establish routines that will help them have a successful year and develop the habit of excellence:

1.) Set a regular bedtime – stick to it. Children need a good night's sleep to function well in school. 2.) Have a regular homework routine including a regular, distraction free workspace. Be available to answer questions, but remember it is your children's homework, not yours! 3.) Practice "backpack basics": first, ask your child to empty his or her backpack each day after school. This way you will receive any notes intended for you and it will give you an opportunity to chat with your child about the school day. You will know if your child is bringing books and other materials home necessary to complete homework assignments; and second, have your child pack their backpack the night before—it will greatly ease the morning routine for everyone. Simple routines such as these teach children responsibility and organization – and make life better for the entire family.

The Family Communication Envelope will go home with the oldest member of your family each Thursday in September and on the first and third Thursdays every month thereafter. No hard copies of this newsletter will go into the envelope unless you notify the school office that you need one. On Thursday mornings, you will receive an email notification that the newsletter is on the website. In today's envelope, look for the September calendar and a lot of information about

WestFest. Please note that the Open House, Back to School for Parents, is next Thursday, Sept. 11, beginning at 6:30pm in Lanigan Gym. This evening is for parents only. Your attendance is strongly encouraged, as this is the BEST chance for you to meet your children's teachers and to learn more about the year's learning goals and classroom expectations. Please make every effort to arrive on time! Also note that next Friday, Sept. 12, is "Flashback to Summer Day", thanks to the principal and vice principal for the day, Bella and Ali Campagnaro! Students may enjoy wearing summer clothes with flip flops. No swimming suits or immodest clothing permitted. One other important date I'd like to point out is our opening School Mass, which will be on Wednesday, Sept. 24, at 8:45am. We invite all of our parents to join us as we pray together for God's blessings on us for a new school year. Students need to be in perfect uniform for Mass. During the warmer weather, students do not need to wear their sweaters or sweatshirts on perfect uniform days. Thanks for supporting the uniform policy. Please remember that boys' hair must be off the collar and both boys' and girls' hair can't be in their eyes. Uniform shorts must be purchased at the Uniform Store. Shorts may be worn all year. Shirts must be long enough to be tucked in and girls' skirts, skorts, and jumpers may not be any shorter than 3 inches above the top of the kneecap. On the days that your children have PE, they MUST have tennis shoes in order to participate in PE class. Classroom teachers will post the days their class has PE on their webpage. Students will receive uniform infractions when they do not follow the uniform policy. Four infractions result in a detention. Please remember that our teachers prefer to focus on their teaching, not on making sure students are dressed properly! appreciate you helping us enforce the Uniform Policy so that is fair for everyone – thank you!
