RED RIBBON EVENT INFORMATION – FROM THE DEVELOPMENT OFFICE Red Ribbon School Day Rally: Thursday, October 16. Red Ribbon Week is the nation's oldest and longest drug prevention program reaching millions of Americans during October every year. By wearing red ribbons young people pledge to lead a drug-free life and pay tribute to DEA Special Agent Enrique "Kiki" Camarena. Our event will include a special all school rally which will be attended by our Seattle City Chief of Police, members of the DEA, FBI and other dignitaries. We also will be honored to hear the widow of Agent Camarena speak to us at our rally. Today, Red Ribbon Week is nationally recognized and celebrated, helping to preserve Special Agent Camarena's memory and further the cause for which he gave his life. The Red Ribbon Campaign has also become a symbol of support for the DEA's efforts to reduce demand for drugs through prevention and education programs.
