As our staff continues to study Washington State's curriculum standards and grade level expectations for each subject area, we are learning that in most cases Holy Rosary not only adequately covers the required standards, but goes well above and beyond them. You may remember that this year we are engaged in the process of curriculum mapping, which has two specific outcomes: 1.) measurable improvement in student performance, and 2.) the institutionalization of mapping as a process for ongoing curriculum and assessment review. It is formal way for a school to develop an operational curriculum that represents what truly happens in the classroom. It is way to make certain that our students are accomplishing the required expectations and that they maintain the highest possible academic standards. I am proud of the work our teachers are doing in the area of curriculum and assessment planning, and I am proud of the dedication of our students. The first trimester ends next Wednesday, with report cards going home on Friday, December 12.

The third graders have created wonderful models of bees and plants that are now on display in the upstairs hallway near the third grade classrooms. This is a part of a unit from the new science kits. Check out the photos showing the 3<sup>rd</sup> graders using their models to perform a dramatization. You also may wish to check out the portrait paintings on display in our main hallway. These were created by the 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade art elective class, under the direction of our art teacher, Ms. Kelsey Boys. Unfortunately, these are not for sale!

Tomorrow the Leadership Elective students are sponsoring Mix It Up Day at Holy Rosary, which is a nation-wide campaign aimed at helping school environments to become more inclusive. Students are invited to enjoy free dress as a visible reminder to "mix it up" and to remember to reach out and make new friends and to be respectful to EVERYONE in their words and their actions.

Congratulations to Sarah Dahleen and our Grants Committee on their most recent successful grant – \$3000 awarded to Holy Rosary from the Tulalip Indian Tribe. The money is earmarked for SmartBoard technology. Great job, Sarah and committee! Thank you.

**GATOR GEAR ORDERING INFORMATION.** The process for ordering Gator Gear sweatshirts and/or sweatpants has been confusing for some people. If you order, fill out a form in the school office. It then gets processed via the CYO coordinator and director. After the checks are gathered, the orders are then sent to Norwest Graphics, owned by the Padon family. The orders are processed every couple of months because it is not cost effective to order a few at a time. Thanks for your patience and understanding!! When the orders are finished, they will be delivered to the oldest child's homeroom teacher. Gator gear can be worn on Fridays, but remember, the sweatshirts worn to school must not have nicknames on them, only first, last names, or initials. Go Gators!!

ACTIVE HEAD LICE HAVE BEEN IDENTIFIED WITHIN THE HOLY ROSARY STUDENT POPULATION. ALL STUDENTS SHOULD BE CHECKED. The parents of all students are being notified via this letter. This is not cause for panic. It is cause for action to be taken to prevent the transmission of head lice. It is extremely important for you to check your child's head TODAY. Keep checking every other day until there are no head lice found for ten consecutive days. Refer to the Detection combing/Scalp checking information sheet located in the Family Handbook. The best way to prevent transmission: Teach children not to share combs, brushes, hair ornaments, hats, caps, scarves, headsets, or any other personal headgear. Do not try on other people's hats (even in department stores). Teach children to hang coats separately - placing hats and scarves inside coat/jacket sleeves. Clean or disinfect shared headgear (i.e., helmets) with Lysol® or rubbing alcohol before being used by others. Conduct regular head checks of your child. Refer to information in school handbook regarding the procedure for "Detection Combing". Long hair should be tied back in ponytail. If head lice are found on your child: Please notify the school office as soon as possible. This information will be handled in a confidential manner Check others in the household for signs of head lice or nits. If live lice are found, complete remaining steps on all infested individuals. Use an effective head lice treatment. Remove nits from the head by "wet combing" with some type of "nit comb" (available at most pharmacies). This is the most important lice control measure. Refer to the "Wet Combing" information sheet located in the Family Handbook Complete nit removal is time-consuming but is critical for successful treatment. There is no need to spray pesticides at home. Perform daily head checks and remove nits for three weeks until head lice are gone. Continue to check your child weekly to detect reinfestation(see "Detection Combing" sheet in Family Handbook. Please notify the school office as soon as possible. This information will be handled in a confidential manner. If nits found on child: Do not use any form of chemical treatment unless live lice are seen on the scalp. A child found to have nits only (no live lice) may remain in school. Most nits are empty shell cases. The nits may remain on the hair for several months before falling off. The school recommends that the nits be removed by the use of one of the two combing methods described in the family handbook. Removing as many of the nits as possible will allow the family an easier examination of the hair living lice. Please keep in mind that whenever searching the Internet for information, many sources of information may be linked to a product and, therefore, may be biased. Please refer to the Head Lice Policy located in the school handbook if live lice are found. If you have difficulties treating the head lice on your child, or in the selection of a lice treatment, please contact your child's physician.
