We wish to offer all of our school families a heartfelt thank you for your generous support of the Holy Rosary School Annual Fund. Gifts came to us from so many within our community including Holy Rosary school families, Holy Rosary parishioners, Holy Rosary School alumni, Holy Rosary School grandparents and many corporations with gift matching programs. The generosity of our entire community is evident in the over \$100,000 in donations received this year. GREEN TIP. April is Gardening Month! It is the season of renewal and life and....recycling! While those plastic spinach boxes from the grocery store can now be recycled, here's a way to give them a new life before they hit the recycling bin. Put a few inches of moist soil in the box, plant some seeds, put the lid on and set it in the window. It can act as a little greenhouse and should create condensation. When the plant starts are up, take off the lid; plant starts as directed on the seed packet. It may also create a little moisture under the box, so protect your counters. Growing your own food is fun and saves grocery dollars. It also saves the energy that would have been spent to transport that food to your table. Plus, fresh picked produce just tastes better, and you know exactly what sprays have or have not been used on your food. Remember that many people have a new garbage pick up day starting this week, and that many more items can be put in the yard waste and the recycling!
