PRINCIPAL SEARCH. The Search Committee met on Wed. 4/22 to begin the process of identifying our new principal; we were joined by Karen Tarabochia from the Archdiocese. As Fr. John noted in his email last week, the committee is comprised of Melissa Witsoe, Mary Rose Blatner, Mary Simpson, Javier Fosado, Fr. John and I. This note is intended to provide information regarding our process.

The process has already begun, with the position having been advertised through both the Archdiocesan website, and that of the National Catholic Education Association (NCEA) website (and thus, we are advertising nationally, and even in Canada).

As part of the process of finding the best possible candidate, we invite the school community (parents and faculty) as well as the broader parish community to provide us with information/suggestions/guidance in this process. To this end, in the next couple of days, a short survey will be available on both the school website and the parish website, through which, comments can be shared to help inform our selection process.

The search committee would encourage all interested members of our community to respond to the survey. We are lucky in that just recently the School Commission completed a detailed survey in support of the 5 Year Plan currently being drafted, so we are already in receipt of a great deal of data and comments from parents. However, that survey did not focus on the specific question of selecting the right person to become our new principal, so we believe it wise to give the community the opportunity to weigh in on this.

In the interim, please don't hesitate to contact me or any other committee members with specific comments or concerns.

The School Commission is a consultative body, advisory to the pastor and principal in the formation of policy and the ongoing development of the school. The Commission contributes their expertise and experience and assists with long range planning, budget preparation, decision-making, policy formation and public relations. Members of the Commission participate with the pastor and the Catholic Schools Department in the selection of a new principal. The School Commission does NOT do the following: discipline, develop programs, approve materials, hire or evaluate staff, tell the principal how to do things, or act as a grievance committee. If you are interested in applying to serve on the School office no later than Thursday, May 7. There are hard copies of this application available in the school office. Julie Campbell and Ann Martin are members of the Commission, but are not listed in the directory.

Yesterday at our weekly staff meeting we began the process of reviewing the data from the Discipline Section included in the recent Parent Survey. We appreciated the time parents took to share their perceptions of discipline in the school. Please be assured that all of your comments are taken seriously and will help us make any necessary adjustments or improvements to our discipline policy. Our work continues tomorrow afternoon at our staff inservice. We will keep you informed!

The April Parents' Club meeting will be next Wednesday, April 29. The School Commission will be presenting highlights from next year's budget, including the tuition rates for next year. I urge you all to attend this important meeting. Mark your calendars now – WEDNESDAY, APRIL 29 BEGINNING AT 6:30PM IN THE SCHOOL HALL. Please remember that in order to receive registration papers for next school year, all tuition, tithing, and parent commitment obligations must be current. Questions, please call Jennifer MacDonald at the rectory, 937-1488, ext. 211. Also, a reminder that in order to qualify for the in-parish tuition rate, families must have a new "Parish Stewardship of Treasure" card on file at the parish office. Cards are available in the school or rectory office. The minimum tithing expectation for in-parish families is \$840.00 yearly or \$70.00 monthly. Thank you so very much for your attention to these important matters.

Holy Rosary will not be giving the WASL test this year, due to the fact that this is the last year for the WASL test. However, students in grades K, 1, 2, 3, 5, & 6 will take the full battery of the Iowa Test of Basic Skills, which compares the student's and the school's performance to other students and schools nationwide. Results of the tests provide us with a deeper understanding of individual student strengths and weaknesses, as well as our school's strengths and weaknesses. Students in grades 4 & 7 will take the Iowa Cognitive Ability Test, which measures a student's developing IQ. Testing will take place April 27-May 8. Please check class newsletters/websites for specific testing days and times. Research shows that students who are well rested and well nourished perform better on standardized tests!

Thank you all for your continued support as we wind down this school year. We appreciate you making sure that your children come to school with their homework completed and wearing the correct uniform. We want all of our students to finish the year feeling proud of their successes and accomplishments and of all that they have learned.

FRIDAY, APRIL 24 will be a noon dismissal day due to the Auction. Students may enjoy free dress on the 24th as a reward from Rocco Buty and Riley Duffy. EVERYDAY IS EARTH DAY AT HOLY ROSARY SCHOOL! According to current statistics **95%** of printer cartridges are simply discarded and end up in landfill sites. It takes 2 ½ ounces of oil to make a new inkjet cartridge. A medium-sized business can use over 1,500 ink cartridges per year, or even more. Since December 2004 Holy Rosary families and businesses have been recycling their inkjet/toner cartridges and cell phones. Together we have saved thousands of items from reaching our landfills. The recycling Program not only supports our environment but helps us raise funds for our school. **Here's how it works: 1. Save your used inkjet/toner cartridges and cell phones** Put the inkjet and toner cartridges in the original packaging or individually in a ziplock bag or baggie. Place cell phones in a ziplock bag. This keeps them from getting damaged in transit. **2. Drop them off** Bring all cartridges and cell phones to Holy Rosary School and place in the collection boxes in the main office. **3. Ask others to help** Ask friends, relatives and employers to help support our recycling efforts.
