May 1 is "One on One" Day at Holy Rosary! Every dollar helps one of our adopted children in Uganda attend school. Thank you. There are some changes & additions to the May calendar: The Living Rosary, originally scheduled for Thursday, May 7, at 2:15, is moved to Tuesday, May 19, at 2:15. Bingo Night scheduled for Saturday, May 9, is CANCELLED. A bake sale sponsored by our 4th grade classes is scheduled for Wednesday, May 13. Each year the 4th grade classes hold a bake sale and use the profits to benefit Mercy Corps. May is a busy month!! We hope you have your May calendar posted on your refrigerator.

Patricia McBrien, our school nurse, has some information on the swine influenza that seems to be spreading across our country. Please read her suggestions and please, please remind your children to wash their hands frequently. Also encourage your children not to share food and drink. Scott is treating commonly used services in the school with hospital grade virus killer. In the event Seattle is put on high alert, the school will immediately follow all guidelines. In the meantime, it would be prudent to keep your child home if he/she has any flu symptoms or is coughing or sneezing.

May is Bike Month! Our Green Team is encouraging our students to bike to school as often as possible during the month of May. On May 8 I will be biking to school, not all the way from the Greenlake area, but from a friend's home in West Seattle. I would love to be joined by as many students and teachers as possible and I will have a special treat for all fellow bikers! So get out those bikes and helmets and plan to bike to school on May 8 and as often as possible in May.

Composting at Holy Rosary officially begins next Monday, thanks to the work of our Green Team and Scott. A representative from Cedar Grove will speak to the students tomorrow morning right after the Prayer Service. SCHOOL HEALTH NEWS. Human cases of swine influenza have been reported in the United States, Mexico and other countries during the past week. This new virus is a hybrid, with genetic elements of swine flu, avian flu, and human flu. There is no vaccine to protect humans against swine flu. Because this is a new strain, seasonal flu shots do not protect people, so good hygiene is important to help prevent the spread of germs. The influenza is spread by coughing, sneezing and unclean hands. The Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC) recommends the following: 1) Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze; 2) If you do not have a tissue; cough or sneeze into your upper sleeve, not your hands.; 3) Put used tissues into the trash; 4) Clean your hands after sneezing or coughing with soap and water. Alcohol-based hand cleaners will work as well, and 5) If you get sick stay home from work or school till you are well and avoid contact with others to keep from infecting them. People cannot get swine flu from eating pork or pork products. If you suspect your child has the flu, call your pediatrician. Anti-viral medication, if taken soon after infection, can shorten the duration of the illness. These medications are effective against swine flu.
