Commercial car washes are required by law to divert their waste water into the city treatment systems, where it can be cleaned before it gets to our streams and then to our wildlife. When we wash a car at home, the waste water flows, untreated, into the local streams and other waters. If you wash your car at home, choose a biodegradable soap, without phosphates or petroleum products. Also, washing your car on your lawn, instead of the driveway, allows your yard to be a filter and catch some of the oil and other gunk your have just washed off your car before they reach the water system. KINDERGARTEN PARENTS. As your child's first year at Holy Rosary School comes to an end and you look forward to Summer Vacation, it's time to start planning for CYO Soccer next fall. Yes, it seams so far away but soon the season will be upon us and we need to start organizing for all the new players. CYO soccer is the first opportunity for your child to participate in a CYO sport with their classmates and represent their school. First grade soccer incorporates micro rules and the teams are co-ed. Micro soccer is the "norm" throughout the State of Washington for this age group and helps to build better skill, ball handling and good fundamentals at an early age. Because of the popularity of this program (200 strong in our parish alone) we really need to get a jump on the season and must have all players registered by the end of July. In years past we have had a large number of fall sign-ups for first grade teams. Due to a change in the team registration deadlines we can not add teams in the fall. Therefore, late registrations can only be accepted if there is room for additional players and even then the expectation should be that there will be very limited additional room. We really want your player to have the opportunity to play on one of the Gator teams so please sign up now and avoid the Hassle. Coaches typically like to begin practices in late August because the first game is the second week of school. There is usually a large turn out for first grade soccer and we will be looking for volunteers to coach three to four teams.
