Welcome back to everyone! We look forward to another year of meaningful and productive partnership with our parents and parish community, as we work to assist students in their journey toward becoming faith-filled, respectful, responsible citizens who communicate effectively and are ready to learn for a lifetime.

In order to facilitate this, we will continue the important work of mapping our curriculum, instructional methods, and assessments to ensure their articulation and alignment with our professional standards and with the Schoolwide Learning Expectations (see previous paragraph). We will also continue our study of the *All Kinds of Minds* model, in order to better recognize and integrate opportunities that address the differentiated needs of many types of learners. Both of these will be instrumental in our accreditation process, which begins this month and which will culminate in our next site visit during the Spring of 2011.

At our staff retreat last week, we focused on a message of spiritual renewal and individual and community wellness. We were able to explore our communication styles and Bishop Tyson spoke to us about our educational roles as faith leaders and models for the students. We used the analogy of the four "rooms" (spiritual, physical, socio-emotional, and intellectual) that reside within each of us, and discussed the importance of regularly visiting and taking care of all four rooms. We welcome and look forward to collaborating with the parish and greater West Seattle communities to help bring this reality to fruition.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD (CLOW)- Leaders and Assistants Needed! During the 9:30am Sunday Mass (September through May), elementary school age children are dismissed after the opening prayer to celebrate their own Liturgy of the Word appropriate for their age level and return to the Mass following the Homily. Children are divided into three groups according to their school grade and each group is assigned a leader: Group 1- Kindergarten & 1st Grade; Group 2- 2nd & 3rd Grade; Group 3- 4th & 5th Grade. No liturgical experience or training is necessary, only a commitment to serve as a CLOW leader or assistant at the 9:30 Mass once or twice a month. The format for CLOW is in place and leaders and assistants use prepared material for each Sunday's readings and guided discussion. Please consider becoming a CLOW leader or assistant (especially if your child attends CLOW) as this program cannot continue without volunteers -or in other words, while the harvest is truly great, the laborers are few.
