Holy Rosary School Family Communication Newsletter

"Emotional Intelligence is a way of recognizing, understanding and choosing how we think, feel and act. It shapes our interactions with others and our understanding of ourselves. It defines how and what we learn; it allows us to set priorities; it determines the majority of our daily actions. Research suggests it is responsible for as much as 80% of the 'success' in our lives." (Handle With Care: Emotional Intelligence Activity Book)

Our *All Kinds of Minds* emphasis for the month of October is "Social Cognition." This includes such important components as communication, social information processing, conflict resolution, and collaboration. Anything we as adults can do to model and teach these skills to our children will be of tremendous benefit to them; as indicated in the above quote, emotional intelligence (including social competence) can be a significant factor in future success.

A related topic is that of effective communication between parents and school personnel. To facilitate this, we need to remember that we are all working together in one of the most important partnerships in our society: that of preparing our young people to be faith-filled, respectful, responsible, lifelong learners who can communicate effectively in the world they will enter as adults. To this end, it is helpful to keep in mind that both roles—parents, as primary advocates and caregivers; and educators, who are faced with meeting the needs of a wide variety of learners within their classrooms—face major challenges and benefit greatly from respectful cooperation.

An important step in this process requires that issues or concerns be presented to the individual(s) who are in the best position to address or respond to them. In other words, I would expect a parent with a question about a program or academic issue to contact the teacher/staff member responsible for that area first. This accomplishes at least three important objectives:

- 1. It ensures that parents receive a more complete understanding of the circumstance than they might have from only hearing the student's or another parent's perspective.
- 2. It promotes a more collaborative, problem-solving approach that is more likely to result in a positive resolution. (Talking to an administrator first is less likely to achieve this outcome and more likely to be seen by staff as usurping their right to address a concern or issue.)
- 3. It provides additional data points for program (and self) evaluation; a single concern based on hearsay might be easily explained; whereas a number of similar concerns with accompanying data might be more likely to cause some justifiable re-evaluation of the effectiveness of a program area.

Finally, if either the teacher or the parent feels like this initial attempt to resolve the issue has been unsuccessful, a second meeting facilitated by one of the administrators would be warranted. I hope that we can all commit to this model, and I would emphasize that respect and management of emotions are important considerations to its success. Ultimately, we as a school community believe it is always beneficial to listen genuinely and with an open mind to concerns voiced by parents, peers, and community members, since they can provide valuable sources of feedback.
