A sincere thanks to everyone who helped make the Centennial Mass so memorable, by attending, encouraging and supporting the day's events. I'm hopeful that we can use this as a momentum builder for increased future school and family involvement in Masses and other faith life activities.

After hearing from Kay Purcell (Archdiocesan Assistant Superintendent) last week, it sounds as though such endeavors will receive particular scrutiny in our upcoming school accreditation. Our efforts to provide data and integrate technology will also be important to examine. Clearly, we are doing many outstanding things educationally at Holy Rosary; everything we can do to provide quantitative and qualitative evidence of the success of these initiatives will be to our benefit.

Thanks to everyone who joined us at Tuesday's Parents Club, as we discussed school and community wellness. *Wellness*, in its broadest sense, is an "active and affirming process through which people become aware of, and make choices toward, a more successful existence." It is "multidimensional and holistic, encompassing lifestyle, mental and spiritual wellbeing, and the environment" (for more information, please visit the website maintained by the National Wellness Institute—based at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point: www.nationalwellness.org).

At Holy Rosary, we hope this translates to a systemic, community-wide commitment to working toward an environment that promotes and protects children's health, well-being, and ability to learn by, among other things, supporting spiritual and academic growth, "good nutrition, effective health education, and multiple opportunities for physical activity" (P.L. 108-265, 2004).

Such efforts seem even more important within the context of the current state of our national health care approach. Childhood obesity, sedentary lifestyles, poor nutritional practices, and early evidence of heart disease, diabetes, and other preventable diseases are increasing at alarming rates. This is of particular concern, as many more children's activity levels are falling below those thought sufficient to promote even basic health benefits.

Such poor health practices in childhood will have an increasingly negative impact on our aging population (those over 65 will double—and over 85 triple—by mid-century). In addition, more Americans, including a third of the poor, do not have access to adequate health care. As a result, health care costs (currently 15% of GDP) could increase to *half* of GDP later this century. In light of these issues, we hope to initiate and expand a community-wide conversation in the coming months about how we might better use our collective resources—at school, in the parish, and throughout the broader community—to positively impact the wellness of families at Holy Rosary and do our part to help address larger societal health concerns.

JOIN US FOR TOMORROW'S PRAYER SERVICE students will get a brief introduction to Family Promise, a parish ministry providing shelter to homeless families here at Holy Rosary on a rotating basis with other local churches throughout the year. Many of our junior high students have donated their time to this organization. If you miss the prayer service, the organization will also be present at all the masses October 24 and 25 where you can learn more.

JOHN HOPKINS TALENT SEARCH The 2009-10. CTY Talent Search sponsored by Johns Hopkins University Center for Talented Youth is underway. The purpose of the Talent Search is to identify, assess and recognize the academic abilities of highly able students. To qualify, a student must score in the 95th percentile or higher on a reasoning section of a nationally-normed test, such as ITBS. Qualified students are offered the opportunity to register for the SCAT test (grades 2-6) or for the SAT or ACT (grades 7-8). A variety of services and opportunities are offered to students after they test. If you are interested in pursuing this opportunity for your child, more information can be found by visiting the website: www.cty.jhu.edu You may determine your child's eligibility based upon last year's ITBS scores.
