Holy Rosary School Family Communication Newsletter

October 29, 2009

Holy Rosary School is once again at the beginning of its cycle of self-reflection as a learning community and accreditation through the Western Catholic Education Association. The process, which begins every six years, lasts for 18 months and focuses upon assessment of student success in meeting School-wide Learning Expectations (SLEs) and Archdiocesan curriculum standards. The basic questions addressed are:

- To what extent is are our faith standards integrated into the school program?
- To what extent are students achieving School-wide Learning Expectations?
- To what extent are students mastering the academic content standards?
- To what extent is there evidence of ongoing academic growth for students?
- To what extent does the school support high achievement for all its students?
- To what extent is data being collected, disaggregated and analyzed?
- To what extent are student learning decisions being made based on the analysis of the assessment data? (WCEA, 2009)

Among the key outcomes expected of the study are the engagement of the school staff and other community members (stakeholders) in the examination of the school's program. (Stakeholders will be representatives of all school and parish committees and commissions). Through this process the school will affirm its evident strengths and identify areas for ongoing improvement.

It will also clarify its mission, philosophy and learning expectations for students. The process will result in the development of an Action Plan that sets goals to enhance student learning and the implementation of an accountability system for monitoring progress. Finally, the completed Self Study component of the accreditation is presented to a Visiting Committee, which comes to the school for an extensive site visit at the end of the process to verify the school's findings.

The kick-off to Holy Rosary's 2009-2011 accreditation cycle will be a stakeholders' meeting on Monday, November 16, at 6:30 p.m. in the School Hall. While available space is initially held for faculty, staff, and representatives from each of the respective parent, school, and parish committees, it is possible that additional room may become available in the event that some of these representatives are unable to attend. In this case, we will invite additional interested community members on a first-come, first-served basis.

After the stakeholders meeting (which will specifically examine the School's Mission, Philosophy, and School-wide Learning Expectations) and throughout the process, we will provide ongoing updates on the progress of our self-study. In addition, we will also encourage additional community participation through such means as focus groups, committee meetings, and electronic feedback through surveys, email, and the website. We welcome your input and look forward to partnering with our community to ensure the continued excellence of students' learning experiences at Holy Rosary School.
