Remember your compassion and love, O Lord; for they are ages old. Remember no more the sins of my youth; remember me only in light of your love.*

Psalm 25: 4-7

As we enter the season of Advent, with its message of prayerful reflection and readiness for the coming of our Lord, we are often more likely to encounter stress and anxiety from the myriad tasks—gift shopping, class parties, Christmas cards, and other holiday distractions—we face. We might benefit by occasionally centering ourselves, and considering these words of wisdom from Edward Hays:

“Advent is the perfect time to clear and prepare the Way; it is a winter training camp for those who desire peace. By reflection and prayer, by reading and meditation, we can make our hearts a place where a blessing of peace would desire to abide and where the birth of the Prince of Peace might take place. Daily we can make an Advent examination:

- Is there a lingering resentment, an unforgiven injury living in our hearts?
- Are we generous with the gifts that have been given to us, seeing ourselves as their stewards and not their owners?

We should, however, take a broad view of how best to use these gifts at a time of year when it may be tempting to limit ourselves to simply dropping a few coins in a kettle. While such giving is without question important, it rarely addresses the root causes of our societal and world problems.

Fr. Brian Cavanaugh points out that, "Works of justice, on the other hand, follow *the road less traveled* of Advent's hope to pursue solutions for difficult problems. Hope comes through works of justice rather than simply performing works of charity." With that in mind, it may be helpful to think about ways we can put into practice the following tenets of social justice teaching, which we will re-visit in greater depth after the New Year:

**Human Dignity**  
**Rights and Responsibilities**  
**Participation**  
**Stewardship of Creation**  
**Role of Government**

**Community and the Common Good**  
**Option for the Poor and Vulnerable**  
**Dignity of Work and Rights of Workers**  
**Solidarity**  
**Promotion of Peace**

These, we can be assured, are truly the gifts of the season “that will keep on giving.”

Please follow these instructions and note that in addition to submitting an application on-line to Fulcrum, paper copies of the completed application must be delivered to Jennifer at Holy Rosary School by **February 5th**:

1. Make 2 copies of your 2008 Federal Income Tax Form(s), IRS 1040, 1040A or 1040EZ, or E-file printout for the financially responsible parent(s) or guardian(s). Note: W-2 forms are not acceptable. Do not send originals.
2. Make 2 copies of any documents related to Non-Taxable income (Part C-3) such as 1099, federal or state aid, alimony or child support.
3. Submit your application form \*online at <http://fulcrumfoundation.org/tuition> *At the end of the submission process a printout will be produced. If you have made a mistake, submit a new application and destroy the incorrect printout. When entering names, please do not use ALL CAPS.*
4. Print 2 copies of the completed form. *This can be done immediately after submitting the form.*
5. Sign the forms in Part E.
6. Staple the signed application in front of copies of the financial documents from steps 1 and 2.
7. Deliver or mail the complete application package to Jennifer at Holy Rosary by February 5th. Copies will not be returned.
