Dear Holy Rosary School Community:

Our sincere gratitude goes out to the chairs, team leaders, and volunteers who worked so hard to make WestFest a great success this year, even in spite of the rain on Friday and Saturday evenings! Thanks, too, to all of the parents and students who showed up and contributed to the sense of community that this event helps us build. We would also like to express our appreciation to all of the families who attended the back-to-school blessing Masses, and to Janet Mudge and her team of musicians for bringing such wonderful, contemporary music to the newly-started Sunday evening Masses. We would truly like to see the numbers attending these Masses continue to grow, as they provide an excellent opportunity for those who have been involved with sports or other youth activities earlier in the day.

We would also like to strongly encourage those parents/community volunteers who need certification in the safe environment program to attend a workshop offered at Holy Rosary on Wednesday, September 29, at 6:30 p.m. If this training has been completed recently, ongoing certification must be maintained online (see information below in eFC). Although we know these requirements--along with process of submitting to a background check when working with our children--are demands on your already precious time, please understand that they are a necessary and important aspect of our parish and school's commitment to the safety of our young people.

The quote (above) that Fr. Ronald Nuzzi from Notre Dame shared at our professional development day last week got to the heart of why it is important for us to integrate our own faith lives into our work. Beyond the fact that we have a commitment to our children to encourage and model a spiritual discernment component to our work, the simple reality is that most roles now come with such inherent challenges that failing to find still, quiet moments of being present with God throughout the day (whether in meditation, prayer, or on a walk) can result in our becoming overwhelmed and burned out.

Fr. Nuzzi also spent time with the principals and pastors of the Archdiocese, outlining the findings of his study, "Faith, Finances, and the Future," which indicated that issues of faith development, Catholic identity, and financial management are consistently listed as the top challenges faced by Catholic schools. Clearly, these are responsibilities that are shared between the parish, school, and parent community. As I mentioned to parents at our Open House earlier this month:

"Simply put, the presence of youth at Masses not only instills our most important School-wide Learning Expectation--being a faith-filled Catholic/Christian--but is also a clear sign of vibrancy and health in a parish. [In addition], the spiritual, cultural, and fiscal health of our school and parish are truly interdependent. I've been around parishes without schools and haven't often felt the same energy and involvement that we have here; likewise, I've been in schools without a close affiliation to their church and...they don't feel like places enriched by the incredible gift of being embraced by the faith life and support of a larger community."

Indeed, the centrality of church and faith in our accreditation process, our mission/vision, and SLE's, and in the core values of Catholic schools, makes it clear that this is an area in which we will continually look for ways to integrate and enhance. As a final plea for our collective participation in the life of the church, please keep in mind that everyone who accepts the in-parish status for school attendance, agrees to be stewards of the parish by: registering as a parishioner, participating in the church by attending Sunday Mass on a regular basis and committing one's time, talent, and treasure in a variety of ways.

The majority of our families carry out these responsibilities with remarkable, selfless regularity and quality; however, in order for our parish and school to continue to thrive and grow, we will need the active participation of all. I wish all of you blessings and a relaxing, contemplative autumn.

For those of you who don't know, Karen has been our Holy Rosary second grade teacher for 2A. She was diagnosed with breast cancer toward the end of the school year last year and is having to take this school year off to undergo treatment. We wanted to send out an update to let you know how she is doing. Karen has started her chemo treatments and is scheduled to continue them through the end of the year. A fund was started in May to cover once weekly house cleaning and twice weekly laundry service. The 2010-11 CTY Talent Search sponsored by Johns Hopkins University Center for

<u>Talented Youth</u> is underway. The purpose of the Talent Search is to identify, assess and recognize the academic abilities of highly capable students. To qualify, a student must score in the 95th percentile or higher on a subtest of a nationally-normed test, such as ITBS. Qualified students are offered the opportunity to register for the SCAT test (grades 2-6) or for the SAT or

ACT (grades 7-8). A variety of services and opportunities are offered to students after they test. If you are interested in pursuing this opportunity for your child, more information can be found by visiting the website: www.cty.jhu.edu You may determine your child's eligibility based upon last year's ITBS scores. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact either Dr. Peters or Mrs. McFaul. Application forms may be obtained in the school office or on-line at the CTY website. There is a cost of \$37 payable to CTY/JHU to register for the optional testing.
