Holy Rosary School Family Communication Newsletter

Dear Holy Rosary Families,

While we've been blessed with some mild fall weather recently and many students/families have been walking to school, it sounds as though the weather pattern may be changing soon. This could contribute to an increase in vehicle traffic during drop-off and pick-up, so we would like to review a couple of safety requests for drivers. First, please **consider dropping off as soon as possible after the window for students arriving begins (8:05 a.m.)**; this lessens the "traffic jam" effect that often takes place, particularly during the last few minutes of morning drop off each day. Second, always **ensure that children are exiting vehicles on the curb side**, and when drop-off takes place in the surrounding blocks please **make sure children cross only at the approved crosswalks**.

On another very important note, please do not use the alley behind the church/parish offices as a drop off point! Since traffic goes both ways in the alley, we have had some close calls with children being dropped off and walking in front of other cars. In addition, it makes it difficult (as well as dangerous) for parish staff who are trying to get into their parking area in the morning and damages relationships with our neighbors who live adjacent to the alley and who have difficulty exiting their garages/driveways in the morning.

Next, so that communication with our parent community remains as effective as ever, please make sure to **read the entire eFC (and any updates on the school <u>website---</u> <u>www.holyrosaryws.org</u>) each week. Since we are going to an entirely electronic communication format this year, it is critical that everyone take the initiative to stay informed. Of the many questions, requests for forms, calendar issues, etc. our office personnel field every week, the vast majority can be answered by reading the eFC and referencing the website.**

Among our key objectives as a school are the facilitation of the very best communication possible with our community (while honoring our commitment to be a Washington Green School, by going paperless), completely transparent policies and processes, and regular opportunities for parent feedback. In order to fully participate and be heard, please read all school communications, attend Parents Club meetings (the first of the year will be at 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, October 15), attend School Commission meetings that are open to the community (the next is on Thursday, November 4), and read posted School Commission minutes.

Finally, the most significant factor facing Catholic schools in the U.S. today (and the single most important criterion in our ability to remain accredited) is that of Catholic identity/faith life. Simply

put, there is no more important contribution that Holy Rosary parishioners and school families can make than to regularly attend Mass as a family and participate fully in the Sacraments and ministries of the church. Catholic schools in America are facing a crisis: In the mid-60's, there were 13,000 Catholic schools in the country with a total enrollment of 5.2 million students; there are now less than half as many schools (just over 7000) and only 2.1 million students enrolled. The vast majority of school closures reflected a decline in the health and strength of the parish church with which they were affiliated and/or a diminishing affiliation with the church in general. We at Holy Rosary can be an anomaly in this era of educational and spiritual challenges; a vibrant, faith-filled, fully integrated parish and school community.

<u>All Kinds Of Minds:</u> During the month of October we are focusing on the construct Temporal-Sequential Ordering which means organizing information by putting things in order and understanding time. For Preschool, Kindergarten and Grade One this could mean the assimilation of basic time and seriation concepts or learning musical rhythms. For grades 1-3 it's a need for phonemic segmentation and resynthesis or a demand for mastery of math algorithms. For grades 4-8 it is the use of extended causal/temporal/procedural chains and an appreciation of temporal relationships for content-area subjects like social studies. Please come check out our new AKOM bulletin board outside the faculty lounge and ask your children about AKOM lessons taught in the classroom this month.

GREEN TIP Facts about Recycling cell phones and printer cartridges

- According to statistics, 95% of printer cartridges are simply discarded and end up in landfill sites. Plastics used in these cartridges take over 1000 years to decompose.
- It takes 2 ½ ounces of oil to make a new inkjet cartridge and up to 3 quarts to produce a toner cartridge.
- Over 40,000,000 pounds of unnecassary waste is added to landfills by cartridges a year.
- There are over 260 million cell phone subscribers in the US today. On average, cell phone users replace old units every 18 months over 100 million units are discarded every year. About 20 % of these old phones are recycled or sent back to manufacturers for proper disposal.

- Once in the landfill, poisonous chemicals from mobile phones such as lead, cadmium, and mercury can potentially contaminate nearby water sources and surrounding soil.
- Recycling or reusing cell phones conserves materials, prevents air and water pollution, and reduces greenhouse gas emissions that occur during manufacturing and processing.

Since December 2004, Holy Rosary families and businesses have been recycling their inkjet/toner cartridges and cell phones. Together we have saved thousands of items from reaching our landfills. The Recycling Program not only supports our environment but helps us raise funds for our school. The best part is that there is nothing to buy and no cost to Holy Rosary! **Here's how it works:**

1. Save your used inkjet/toner cartridges and cell phones

Put the inkjet and toner cartridges in the original packaging or individually in a ziplock bag or baggie. Place cell phones in a ziplock bag. This keeps them from getting damaged in transit.

2. Drop them off

Bring your used cartridges and cell phones to Holy Rosary School and place them in the collection boxes in the main office.

3. Ask others to help
