Dear Holy Rosary Families,

Tonight (Thursday, October 14) is the first Parent Club meeting of the year and it presents our community with a very special opportunity. After a short recap of Parent Club business, Sr. Miriam James Heidland will give a talk entitled, "Healing the Family: The Transformative Power of Authentic Love." Sr. Miriam James comes highly recommended from other schools and has a fascinating, inspiring story: an accomplished volleyball player at the University of Nevada-Reno who was living the classic college student-athlete existence, she increasingly began to question her purpose and mission in life and was ultimately led to a path of religious contemplation and service. She has coached volleyball at Archbishop Murphy HS, works from St. Alphonsus Parish, and clearly connects with young adults through, among other things, a love of music, sports, and faith life. The program begins at 6:30 p.m. We would really like to increase our attendance and involvement at Parents Club meetings this year. In order to encourage this, we have slightly decreased the number of meetings, added a Parent Education component to most events, and are requesting that at least one parent from each family make it to the meetings, if possible.

Parent-teacher-student conferences, an important event in our partnership with the community, **come up next week.** This is an excellent opportunity to find out how your child is adjusting to the new school year and to get to know his/her teachers better. According to the Family Education website, some ideas for having a successful conference experience include:

Jot down the things that you would like to talk about at the conference.

Arrive promptly or a few minutes early.

Avoid lengthy discussions of topics that are not related to the purpose of the conference.

Be open-minded to suggestions from the teacher.

Keep your emotions under control.

Take notes about what has been discussed.

Express appreciation for the conference.

Do not stay beyond your allotted time.

Although students and teachers have planned to share specific information, if you are unsure of what to ask, the ERIC Digest offers the following suggestions:

- 1. What does my child do that surprises you? Sometimes a child will behave quite differently at school than at home, so the parent may be surprised, as well.
- 2. What is my child reluctant to do? This may reveal more about a child's interests/dislikes and may encourage discussion about the child's academic and social preferences.

- 3. What is a goal you would like to see my child achieve? This can serve as a springboard for parents and teachers to develop a plan to work together to help a child set and reach a specific outcome. All children benefit from setting goals in areas that need improvement or in which they might excel.
- 4. What can I do at home to support what is being done at school? This question is always appreciated and helps to create a team feeling.

Effective parent-teacher conferences take place in an atmosphere of trust, where confidentiality is ensured and parents and teachers treat each other with respect. When children have learning or behavioral challenges, it may be helpful to examine the context in which they occur and then to formulate a plan of action. Sometimes it is helpful to include the child in setting goals and reviewing the effectiveness of plans. Children are more likely to succeed in school if they can view their parents and teachers working together cooperatively.
