Dear Holy Rosary School Families:

We'd like to extend our sincere thanks for your partnership in holding another very successful week of Parent-Student-Teacher Conferences. It can be quite a logistical (not to mention exhausting, for the teachers!) feat to schedule and undertake almost 500 individual conferences in a three-day period but, with your help and our faculty's diligence, we were again able to contribute to the home/school communication that is one of the strengths of our community.

On a similar note, we have seen a significant improvement in the drop-off and pick-up procedures this year. Additional staff and volunteer supervision, the willingness of our 8th graders to assist with crossing at the corners, and enhanced signage indicating that 42nd is a one way street have all contributed to the betterment of our children's safety.

There is, however, always room for improvement: Bruno, our intrepid crossing guard, has requested that drivers pay close attention to traffic before pulling out, not stop in the middle of the road, and please, please, not use cell phones while in the process of dropping children off. Also, it would be greatly appreciated if everyone would again remind their sons/daughters never to cross the street in the morning without being directed by one of the crossing personnel and always to cross at the crosswalks.

Finally, it has become evident during the course of our school accreditation work that knowledge and awareness of our School wide Learning Expectations could be better communicated. This set of expectations, which—along with Archdiocesan/State Learning Standards—form the core of our academic, behavioral, and spiritual identity as a school, is something that we take seriously and something for which we are evaluated by our accrediting organization.

They are, essentially, intended to be a picture of the Holy Rosary "Grad at Grad," (Graduate at Graduation). We would ask all parents to carefully read over them with your children; we will be focusing on these in upcoming eFC letters and, perhaps, having some fun with our attempts to elevate them in the community's consciousness! The revised (to make them more measurable and more user friendly for the students) set of SLEs is as follows:

Here is what we heard from you:

54 people took the survey – there was equal participation in the survey from all grade levels.

54% attend West Fest for financial support to our school.60% attend to have fun.33% attend as a volunteer only.

88% of respondents visited the West Fest web site.61% used the web site to sign up to volunteer.81% of respondents had a positive volunteer experience.

59% of respondents purchased a raffle ticket.

86% say the prices are right.
