Dear Holy Rosary Families,

Peace and blessings to all of you in this time of thanksgiving and togetherness. In that spirit, I continue to be amazed and grateful for the overwhelming abundance of commitment, time and talent that you as a community dedicate to our school. I've said this many times, but I have never witnessed giving to a school on this scope and scale and I am so appreciative that we are the beneficiaries of your kind largesse.

As we continue through the year, I will provide regular updates on our school's major initiatives, from our accreditation work, to our progress on the school's strategic plan, the results of the most recent parent survey, and our integration of *All Kinds of Minds*. Among the most important dates to remember in this regard are those of our important **school accreditation site visits**. The pre-visit will take place on **February 17th, 2011**, and the entire accreditation team will be in residence all day (and most of the evening) from **March 14-16, 2011**. We will be asking our entire community for help in putting our best face forward during that time.

One of the most clearly stated expectations of our school improvement process is the development, common awareness, and meaningful use of a set of **Schoolwide Learning Expectations**—the qualities that we as a community hope to instill in our children by the time they graduate. We encourage parents to become familiar with these principles, and to talk with children about them in ways that will reinforce what we are teaching at school and enhance their tendency to put them into practice. With that in mind, the first SLE that we promote is that students become:

1. Faith-filled Catholics (or members of other faith communities) who know and practice the foundations and traditions of the Catholic/Christian faith.

This can only become a reality if families and school personnel alike teach, model, and provide opportunities for our young people to learn, discuss, ask questions about, practice, and reflect on their faith lives within the context of regular, communal family, parish, and school life.

In this regard, Holy Rosary School received very high marks in the last parent survey, with 97% of respondents agreeing (or strongly agreeing) that the religion program at HRS is given a high priority and over 93% agreeing/strongly agreeing that our school Masses and prayer services are meaningful for students.

This area is correlated to the stated objective of our school's strategic plan, which identifies the need to further develop school/parish relations. To address this, we are in the process of establishing a committee to promote our communication and participation with the parish, and we have increased efforts to support parish service programs and expand family participation in ministries and liturgies. These efforts are in their early stages and, as such, we invite additional input and participation in bringing about a more connected whole in our shared spiritual life.

Our sincere thanks to the entire community, and may you and your extended families experience a restful, joyful, and meaningful Thanksgiving holiday.
