All Kinds Of Minds

During the month of January we are focusing on the construct Memory which is the place in your mind where you store and find information. For Preschool, Kindergarten and Grade One this could mean a call for deliberate paired associate learning (e.g. grapheme:phoneme) or an introduction of abstract, symbolic visual memory. For grades 1-3 it's a stress on convergent single-item recall (math facts, sight words), experience with rote learning, and/or differentiation of abilities by format. For grades 4-8 it is a demand for rapid simultaneous recall, a need for active working memory and/or stress on automatized recall of facts and procedures (as in mathematics). Please come check out our new AKOM bulletin board outside the faculty lounge and ask your children about AKOM lessons taught in the classroom.

<u>PowerSchool Server Migration</u> - Holy Rosary School will no longer be hosting it's own PowerSchool server due to several reasons. The server data will be migrated to Pearson, the company who owns and operates the PowerSchool software. This migration will occur **next Wednesday and Thursday, January 12th and 13th**. We have been told that we **are not** to access the PowerSchool server at this time or else the data could be altered. A reminder email will be sent to families next week. A few things will change such as the URL you use to access PowerSchool, however most everything should look the same. We should also gain faster access and no down time. We are sorry for any inconvenience and thank you for your cooperation.

If you are a current school family and intend to register your child for either preschool or kindergarten for 2011-12 school year at Holy Rosary, please fill out the attached form intent to register form and return it to the office. <u>The Application For Tuition Assistance For The 2011-12 School Year</u> is now available on-line at http://fulcrumfoundation.org/tuition (A link to the application is on the school website under 'School Forms & Other Downloads'.)

Please follow these instructions and note that in addition to submitting an application on-line to Fulcrum, paper copies of the completed application must be delivered to Jennifer at Holy Rosary School by **February 4th**:

- 1. Make a copy of your 2009 Federal Income Tax Form(s), IRS 1040, 1040A or 1040EZ, or Efile printout for the financially responsible parent(s) or guardian(s). Note: W-2 forms are not acceptable. Do not send originals.
- 2. Make a copy of any documents related to Non-Taxable income (Part C-3) such as 1099, federal or state aid, alimony or child support.

- 3. Submit your application form *online at http://fulcrumfoundation.org/tuition At the end of the submission process a printout will be produced. If you have made a mistake, submit a new application and destroy the incorrect printout. When entering names, please do not use ALL CAPS.
- 4. Print two copies of the completed form. This can be done immediately after submitting the form. Be sure to sign your tax forms. This is often overlooked, especially with E-filing. Fulcrum will not accept un-signed forms.
- 5. Sign the form in Part E.
- 6. Staple the signed application in front of copies of the financial documents from steps 1 and 2.
- 7. Deliver or mail the complete application package to Jennifer at Holy Rosary by February 4th. Copies will not be returned.

January 6, 2011

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January - Ordinary Time - the liturgical color is green which symbolizes growth, hope, and life.

Epiphany-

The roots of our modern day Epiphany are many. The word itself comes from a Greek word that means, "appearance" or "to show oneself." Today eastern churches still celebrate this day as the Baptism of our Lord. In the Catholic tradition we observe Epiphany as the day the three kings visited Jesus and acknowledged Him as the savior of the world has been waiting for.

Tradition gives them the names Melchoir, Balthazar and Casper. We know that they were scientists who studied astronomy, math, and probably medicine. They were aware of the prophecies of the birth of God's Son and the salvation that He would bring to the world. They looked for a sign of the Messiah's birth in the stars. When the brightest star they had ever seen appeared in the sky, the kings knew that they had to follow it to find the Son of God.

Some creative ideas to celebrate Epiphany with Children:

- Go through Christmas cards and find any cards with the 3 Kings have the children cut these out and create a placemat for meals.
- Kings cake: hide a safe-treat in a cupcake, the child who finds the treat is King for the day and gets to wear a crown and gets a special gift
- Follow the Star Play hide and seek with the goal of finding a shiny foil-covered cardboard star.
