Holy Rosary School Family Communication Newsletter

Dear Holy Rosary Families:

The approach of our mid-winter break and the season of Lent brings an opportunity to step back and reflect prior to the welcome renewal of spring and the blessed hope of Easter. The process of reflection is also being undertaken at Holy Rosary School as we enter the first on-site phase—the pre-visit—of our accreditation process. A team of teachers and administrators from other Catholic schools throughout Washington and California will come to our school for a total of four days over the next month to visit classes, meet with our staff and members of the school and parish community, read our self-study document, and make a recommendation to our accrediting agency, the Western Catholic Education Association.

There are a number of very prevalent themes to the most recent accreditation protocol: integrating Schoolwide Learning Expectations—particularly Catholic identity—into all school processes, alignment of teaching and learning with state and Archdiocesan standards, and using academic data to drive instruction. We believe we have made excellent progress in these important initiatives since our last accreditation, but our current goals and action plan reflect our desire to continue them in order to grow as a learning community. These goals will be the focus of upcoming parent communications.

Finally, as we mentioned in previous communications, we have had two members of our staff move on in the past month:

- Mr. Millan will be leaving the role of Spanish instructor after many years of dedicated service to the school. Ms. Carole Myers has agreed to serve as a long-term substitute for the remainder of the school year. Ms. Myers, who taught in the Edmonds School District for 37 years, began teaching Spanish at the elementary level and eventually moved to middle and then high school roles. She retired 5 years ago and has enjoyed subbing in Catholic schools since. She had two children who graduated from Bishop Blanchet.
- Ms. Sarah Dahleen, a Holy Rosary parent and an outstanding development director and valued member of our staff, is leaving to begin a similar development role at Eastside Catholic. Ms. Kimberly Tish, another Holy Rosary parent with a background in advertising, will be helping out part-time this spring with the component of the development role pertaining to the Holy Rosary HEART Auction.

More on the future structuring and posting of these roles will be forthcoming as we complete our budget and planning process for the 2011-2012 academic year.

All Kinds Of Minds

During the month of February we are focusing on the construct of Social Cognition which

is the way we use words and actions to get along with others. For Preschool, Kindergarten and Grade One this could mean the need to emerge from parallel play, compliance with adult supervision in play, and/or the initial challenge of sharing and conflict resolution. For grades 1-3 it's the need to appreciate the perspectives of others, the requirement of recognizing the two-way nature of relationships, and/or a demand for reciprocity (giving and taking). For grades 4-8 it is a quest for intimacy in friendship, the need for conscious reputation building, and/or the emergence of varying degrees of friendship. Please come check out our new AKOM bulletin board outside the faculty lounge and ask your children about AKOM lessons taught in the classroom.

7th Grade Service Project: Donations for Westside Baby

Please consider making a donation to our 7th Grade Service Project to help families in need.

Westside Baby is a nonprofit organization that collects previously owned items for children and babies, and distributes them free of charge to South King County families in need. They work through local social service agencies already assisting low-income families. Agencies order items from Westside Baby and deliver them to families who are homeless, living in transitional housing or are simply in need of a little help during a difficult time.

Since opening in 2001, they have distributed over \$6 million worth of clothing, toys, baby gear, and other items. In 2009, they served more than 15,000 children.

In 2010, not all requests were able to be fulfilled, and some families were not able to receive the goods they needed, which is why we are spreading the word through the eFC.

We are holding a drive for these unmet requests, so that families will be able to receive basic things they need.

We are primarily looking for **gently used and clean clothing items**, **newborn to size 12**, **especially winter coats**. We are also looking for **car seats**, **portable cribs**, **highchairs**, **and regular strollers**, but **anything helps**.

February - Ordinary Time - the liturgical color is green which symbolizes growth, hope, and life. Originally President's day was set aside to honor George Washington's (our first president) birthday, February 22nd, in recent times his birthday is celebrated on the third Monday of February.

Activity and Prayer: Gather Coins and other currency look at the pictures of presidents on the currency. Reflect about what qualities these presidents were famous for and which qualities were in-line with the values of our faith and which are not. Then share this prayer: "On this day we honor all the presidents of the United States. We thank God for the willingness of these people to serve their country in so many ways. May God bless and keep our current President and all those who serve before him. Amen."
