Mustard Seed Corner – February 20/24

February - Ordinary Time - the liturgical color is green which symbolizes growth, hope, and life. Mardi Gras/Fat Tuesday/Shrove Tuesday/Pancake Day

Mardi Gras - Since the future Mustard Seed Corner discuss Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the season of Lent, this week's contribution will discuss "Fat Tuesday." Mardi Gras is French for "Fat Tuesday" and is celebrated on March 8th this year. While Mardi Gras is technically the day before Ash Wednesday, Mardi Gras in some places reflects at least two weeks of carnival before the serious more disciplined days of Lent. New Orleans is well known for its festive celebration of Mardi Gras, so many decorations, and celebration ideas that surround the Mardi Gras have a New Orleans influence.

Shrove Tuesday – Tradition tells of the Shriving Bell which means a bell that rang to for people to come to church and be "shriven." Shriven was to confess your sins before the season of Lent. Early Christians observed strict rules of fasting and self-denial during Lent, so in the days before Lent, they would party, eat restricted foods, and have fun.

Pancake Day – in England people used up the "rich" foods of eggs, butter, milk (from which they will fast from during lent) to make pancakes. Some towns in America and England celebrate this tradition by eating pancakes on this day and have a Pancake Race.
