Mustard Seed Corner – June 2nd (Ascension)

This section of the EFC is written by HR Parish Faith Formation staff and is specially created to present information, inspiration, and education on different aspects of Catholic Tradition. (It is not Imprimi Potest, Nihil Obstat, or Imprimatur.)

Liturgical Color – The Easter Season color is white reminding us of victory and joy. "But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be my witness in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and to the end of the earth." And when he had said this they were looking on, he was lifted up, and cloud took him out of their sight." Acts 1:8,9

Christ's Ascension is a mystery of faith, just as his Incarnation and Resurrection. Something happened between Jesus' bodily rising from the dead and the time when humans no longer physically saw him their presence, but we cannot fully understand what that was. St. Luke describes the Ascension at the end of his gospel and again at the beginning of the Acts of the Apostles, through his descriptions vary in detail. The Ascension of the Lord always falls on the 40th day after Easter, which is a Thursday. In many dioceses, this important feast is celebrated on the following Sunday. Ascension literally means to go up, and on this day we commemorate the earthly body of Jesus going up to heaven. Jesus and his disciples were on the Mount of Olives near Jerusalem. He told his followers that soon they would receive the power of the Holy Spirit, and then it would be up to them to spread the Good News of his Resurrection to the rest of the world. An angel appeared after Jesus ascended and promised that Jesus would someday return.
