Online Payments: New this year, in order to provide more security for your bank account information, we have set up an online payment site for you so that you may directly input your own bank information. Once you have created a profile, you will be able to make school payments online, i.e., milk, yearbook, pizza lunch, etc. So many school families have asked for this option - we are pleased to accommodate you! When you go online the first time, you will be asked to

create a profile, select your tuition payment option, enter your Church ID# and then provide your bank account information. If you do not know your Church ID#, please call Thea DeFrancesco. If you have any questions, concerns or you need assistance, please let us know. Thank you.

Classroom Supply Lists are available on the school website, under "School Forms and Other Downloads" on the right hand side of the page. Please make sure your child has the necessary items on the first day of school.

The Kindergarten Tea will be held on Thursday, September 1st at 10am in The School Hall. Please call the school office if you have not received an invitation.

Back to School Coffee for all parents will be hosted by Parents Club on Tuesday, September 6th, the first day of school. Please stop by the school hall starting at 8:15 for coffee and conversation.

First Week of School Schedule: The first day of school is Tuesday, Sept. 6. Dismissal is at noon for grades 1-8 and at 10:00 am for Kindergarten. On Wednesday, Sept. 7 school dismisses at 2:15 pm for grades 1-8 and noon for kindergarten. On Thursday, Sept. 8 Grades 1-8 will dismiss at 3:00 pm and Kindergarten will dismiss at noon. Friday, Sept. 9 is a noon dismissal for everyone.

Back To School Night for Parents is scheduled for Thursday, **September 22nd**. We will begin at 6:00 pm for food and fellowship. This is a change from the original date printed on the school calendar. Please mark the new date on your calendar. The evening provides the best opportunity for you to meet your children's teachers and find out about classroom goals and learning expectations.

Professional Development For Staff: School dismisses at 2:15 p.m. **every** Wednesday for staff meetings and professional development.

Uniform Policy: Students should be in the correct uniform on the first day of school. A copy of the policy and information about purchasing school uniforms can be found on the school website under "Forms and other Downloads" and then click on "Purchasing School Uniforms". GATOR GEAR INFORMATION

On Fridays at Holy Rosary, the kids can wear a navy blue or red Gator Gear "hoodie" Sweatshirt. Also, if you'd like, you can order Gator Gear sweatpants in grey or navy. However, only the sweatshirts can be worn to school as part of the uniform on Fridays.

To order, just go to the school website, click on "School forms & other downloads." At the very end of all the links, there is a site that says "CYO FORMS." You'll see the Gator Gear order form. Click on it, fill it out and turn it into the school office. We'll process your order as soon as we can, then we'll give the orders to the school office. The 7th/8th grade Leadership elective kids give the "Gator Gear" to your oldest childs' classroom teacher. Your child is responsible to bring it home.

Immunizations: If you have a child entering kindergarten or sixth grade, please send in the correct immunization forms indicating they are current with their vaccinations. Washington State law requires that all schools keep accurate immunization records on all students. **Forms are Due the first day of school.**

Medication Policy: Washington State Law requires In order to dispense medication, including albuterol inhalers, EpiPens, etc to your child the office must have an oral medication/prescription permission form authorized by a Licensed Healthcare Provider, who has prescribed the medication and the parent/legal guardian.

The parent/guardian must also provide the medication, which is from a Licensed Healthcare Provider in its original labeled container from the pharmacy. The container must include the name of the student, medication, dosage information and enough medication to be administered at school. For non-prescription medications such as Aspirin, acetaminophen, and ibuprofen the school also needs an oral medication/prescription form signed by a health provider and parent. No Medication will be given to a child without an oral medication/prescription form on file. WestFest Rides Wristband Sales: There are less than 2 weeks of school before WestFest this year. Plan now to buy your rides wristbands before the event for big savings! Pre-sale wristbands cost \$8 for Friday night, \$13 for all day Saturday or \$20 for both days. The day of the event prices jump to \$10 for Friday night, \$15 for Saturday or \$25 for both days. The last day for pre-sales will be Thursday, September 15 until 10:00 AM. Any orders received after that time will be processed for the full cost. Wristbands will also be on sale after Masses September 10 and 11.
