Service Hour Transition Amendment

Preface:

In an effort to better accommodate Kindergarten families into the service hour cycle, a shift from one reporting cycle to another took place this year. Unintentionally, this presented challenges in maintaining adequate support of volunteer fund-raising efforts. In forecasting the impact of a potential shortage of available volunteers, the auction committee alerted us to what they saw as an impending crisis. We substantiated this through an analysis that included a survey of parents. Further, the school made an appeal, which partially answered the need to fill needed positions but still left serious concerns concerning auction staffing. The financial impact of the auction on the operating budget required careful study of the problem, which the School Commission undertook.

Summary of Plan:

I think what we have is a two year transition rather than a one year transition from the old reporting period to the new. I also think it important that we remind ourselves of what volunteer hours are, and what they mean. The community aspect of this school is one of the aspects that helps make this an outstanding school. Teachers put in an extra effort and go beyond their call of duty and thus set a standard of excellence at Holy Rosary; but we can all clearly see that this is also what the parents do and have done,

all in an effort to better serve Jesus Christ and in doing so better serve the needs of the children here. As I stated above, many parents now and in the past have gone well beyond the requirements. From my experience at four schools, this is especially true of those parents that facilitate successful auctions. Auctions are labor intensive and heavily depend upon parent leaders at the helm of key sub-committees.

Our current parents that are serving on the auction committee in key roles have asked for help in achieving success. Not their success but the success of the auction, which directly impacts our program for the children of Holy Rosary School. They already go beyond the call of duty and I trust that they will continue to do so if we respond in their hour of need. I feel it right and just to respond to their request. I fully accept that there are different reasoned points of view. There are valid concerns in the variety of directions we could take. But there always are in tough decisions.

If after prayerfully considering their participation in this year's auction, parents that have already clocked their required hours may opt to:

Clock up to 15 hours toward next year.

Key project leads who put in 50+ hours during the auction after March 1st may after prayerful consideration, clock up to 25 hours for next year pending their help in securing replacements should they choose to turn over their positions. This can be worked out through the committee.

This is a **one-time amendment** that allows us to adjust to the circumstances that we need to address. While I think it will impact us next year, I have concluded that this should be minimal. I trust in this community and in those that have cared enough to go beyond the call, I believe that in seeing that we acknowledge the challenge and have offered up a plan that respects the valid concerns of the auction committee-that we will not go wanting. This has been a school community based upon the trust and good-

will that has always been part of this storied school. I think it is in the best interest of the school that we embrace this decision, and move forward toward a successful auction now and into the future. I want to thank the School Commission members for all their thoughts and input in this process. It has been invaluable in helping us move forward. I would also like to thank the auction committee for their service to our school, for their patience while we worked this out and for speaking up in time for us to consider and plan and finally to set a course for success now and into the future.

At this week's faculty meeting, Ms. Darcy McLaughlin will be presenting information on the All Kinds of Minds program. She will be encouraging her fellow teachers to continue to explore and develop our academic programs that take into account the latest research on differentiated education. I am looking to re-invigorate the work already begun in this area.

We are currently planning to arrange for additional training for the teachers in their use of the Smart Boards. This training (this spring) will take place here at school and will be in an interactive format. The expectation is to facilitate greater use of the Smart Boards in their lessons.

Quite a number of teachers have taken advantage of training opportunities this year and the school will continue to support them to allow them to attend workshops that enable them to develop their teaching abilities. Mrs. McFaul is our coordinator of the Title II funds that finance the majority of these workshops.

I established working curriculum teams at the beginning of the year. We are now well underway in a variety of ways. This in intended to not only improve teacher collaboration, but instructional improvement, through the use of a structured discussion and outline throughout the year and into next year in the case of Language Arts.

One aspect of my strategy to move the school forward this year is to be very present in the classroom. This I have done and will continue to do. This gives me a chance to not only see, understand and evaluate, but also to commend students and teachers in their learning environment. Obviously, this is a big school with seasoned and valued teachers. Relationship building is linked to instructional improvement, as I serve as a sort of academic coach to both students and teachers. As I get to better understand the teachers and their gifts and talents, I can adopt strategies to help them to better serve the children of Holy Rosary.

I am committed to moving this school forward!

In the exercise gym I have heard people say you have to do 21 days straight to begin to make exercise a habit on your schedule: in the spiritual gym we say it takes 40 days to establish a spiritual habit.
