#### FOR PARENTS OF CHILDREN IN K-7th GRADE!

Holy Rosary is looking to start our First Lego League team in September and we are actively searching for Coaches and Mentors! First Lego League is a great opportunity to get kids excited about Science, Technology and Engineering. The program allows kids to use their creativity to solve a real world problem while gaining skills in team building and technology.

Coaches. What's required to be a Coach? NO special expertise is needed, just patience, dedication and a willingness to learn alongside the team. Coaches facilitate the process the team follows without providing the solution yourself. You provide guidance, structure, encouragement and a fun experience. Teams consist of up to 10 kids and typically meet twice a week for 1-2 hours Sept.-Nov. to design their robot for the competitions in December. Coaches are provided with a detailed handbook and various online workshop options.

Mentors. How about contributing as a Mentor? Mentors work with the team in their area of expertise for at least one meeting. Mentors provide valuable one on one interaction and serve as resources in their specialties. In addition to having the needed expertise the most important quality for a Mentor is someone who enjoys working with young people and wants them to learn. Possible Mentor contributors include:

- Engineers
- Science Professionals
- Graphic Artists
- Carpenters
- Programmers
- Marketing Experts

The competitions start in the first week of December. Here are a few more important dates:

Early May Registration opens for FLL (First Lego League for grades 4-8).

Early August Registration opens for Jr.FLL (grades K-3).

Mid to Late Sept. Registration closes.
