I would also like to share some of the goals and objectives that I have identified in the curriculum area this year:

Complete the work of the curriculum committees that were formed last year-

(Science; Implement Best Practices of Robert Marzano across the curriculum; Implement the new School Wide Learning Expectations; continue to develop and build upon the work of our Math Committee; Incorporate the findings of our Reading Committee; Continue to study and analyze standardized test data to drive instructional improvement)

The whole faculty will be focused on a detailed study of our Language Arts program. We will do this across the curriculum so that not only will those that teach Language Arts directly but those that teach indirectly have a chance to examine our approach and seek ways to improve. I might add that our Language Arts program is an area of strength at Holy Rosary School but I don't want to become complacent. We will take ourselves to the next level of excellence.

We will continue to build upon the deep understanding our faculty has of the relationship between brain development and effective teaching strategies. Our faculty has a deep appreciation and keen interest in this area and this is a very positive thing from my perspective. This is cutting edge and fits well with the solidity and approach we have at the center of good solid basic teaching, something Holy Rosary School has been great at throughout its history.

We will get a jump-start on transitioning to the Common Core Standards. We will begin with Math and by starting this year; we will be a year ahead in the adoption process. Common Core is the latest development in the standards based movement. These Common Core standards were formed from the best State Standards from across the country as well as input from University experts as well as teachers and administrators. The bar is clearly set, and we will once again exceed, as is our tradition here!

Professional Development For Staff: School dismisses at 2:15 p.m. **every** Wednesday for staff meetings and professional development.

Medication Policy: Washington State Law requires In order to dispense medication, including albuterol inhalers, EpiPens, etc to your child, the office must have an oral medication/prescription permission form signed by the parent and authorized by a Licensed Healthcare Provider who has prescribed the medication.

The medication, from a Licensed Healthcare Provider must be in its original labeled container from the pharmacy. The container must include the name of the student, medication, dosage information and enough medication to be administered at school. For non-prescription medications such as Aspirin, acetaminophen, and ibuprofen the school also needs an oral medication/prescription form signed by a health provider and parent.

No Medication will be given to a child without an oral medication/prescription form on file. Please Download the oral medication/prescription form from the Holy Rosary website under "Forms and Other Downloads".

Drop-off/Pick- up: We ask that you observe the following for everyone's safety and convenience. Please DO NOT EVER park along 42nd Avenue in front of the school during morning drop off between 8am – 8:30am. Drivers should never leave their vehicles when dropping off in front of the school or in the alley. Please use the crosswalks. If the traffic manager directs you please follow the instructions immediately. Also please remember that the HEART Auction parking spot is always reserved for the family who purchased it; please do not park in or block that space at any time. Please do not drop off students in the alley behind the rectory.

GATOR GEAR INFORMATION

On Fridays at Holy Rosary, the students can wear a navy blue or red Gator Gear "hoodie" sweatshirt. Also, if you'd like, you can order Gator Gear sweatpants in grey or navy. However, only the sweatshirts can be worn to school as part of the uniform on Fridays.

To order, just go to the school website, click on "School forms & other downloads." At the very end of all the links, there is a site that says "CYO FORMS." You'll see the Gator Gear order form. Click on it, fill it out and turn it into the school office. We'll process your order as soon as we can, then we'll give the orders to the school office. The 7th/8th grade Leadership elective kids give the "Gator Gear" to your oldest childs' classroom teacher. Your child is responsible to bring it home.
