This week, I would like to introduce a two-part series that focuses on our marvelous Kindergarten program. I have been so impressed by our Kindergarten program. I thought that you might want to share in my recent conversation I had with four of Holy Rosary's finest! This week the focus is on KA, next week it will be on KB.

Mrs. Clarke and Mrs. Madsen, Kindergarten-A

Questions:

How long have each of you worked at Holy Rosary and how long have you worked together?

Mrs. Clarke: I brought my oldest daughter to kindergarten here at Holy Rosary back in 1997 so in many ways I feel like I have been here forever. I started working here as a sub in 2003, working mainly in the upper grades and library. In 2004, I joined the faculty as the KA teacher. Mrs. Madsen and I are in our fifth year together.

Mrs. Madsen: As Mrs. Clarke mentioned, we are in our fifth year together and both of us are looking forward to many more.

What do you like best about working with kindergarteners?

Mrs. C: It is hard to pinpoint exactly what I like best about teaching kindergarteners, but it would probably be watching them develop into readers. I am always amazed by how much they achieve over the course of the year, when you consider that many of the children come in with a tenuous understanding of the alphabet and most leave reading!

Mrs. M: There are so many fantastic things I love about working with kindergarteners! Their innocence and eagerness to learn is magnificent. They are so excited to be at school each day and bring so much personality and joy to our classroom.

How do you manage all those little angels?

Mrs. C: Management at any grade is very much the same—setting your expectations and then following up with gentle reminders. I try very hard to create a positive learning environment using this technique and for the most part I would say it works!

Mrs. M: Mrs. Clarke does a great job with classroom management and I have witnessed what a talented skill this is. The children thrive from it and grow academically, spiritually and socially.

How has the kindergarten curriculum developed over the years?

Mrs. C: Kindergarten has changed only slightly in the last eight years as many 7th graders can attest. They did many of the very same activities we do now. The number of sight words has increased to 100!

What are some of the highlights each year?

Mrs. C: There are so many highlights, but one of my favorites has always been the kindergarten tea, because it is the first time I get to see the children together as a class. I am also a big fan of the "friendly beasts" and the leprechaun shenanigans every St. Patrick's day.

Mrs. M: Many highlights including: mastering the alaphabet, learning to read, the Thanksgiving feast, and of course, the Mother's Day Prayer Service.

Why do you think Holy Rosary is such a special school?

Mrs. C: I don't think I can put into words how much Holy Rosary means to me. I feel as though this community helped me raise my children whom I am so proud of. It is also where my husband and I met so many of our best friends. What a gift!

Mrs. M: Holy Rosary School shines with community spirit! It is such an amazing and bonding Catholic environment that I am proud and honored to be a part of.

Wow! I hope that you have enjoyed getting a brief insight into our Kindergarten program through the words of two wonderful educators who are treasured members of our faculty at Holy Rosary School.

 Deadline for Fulcrum Tuition Assistance Application approaching. School families intending to apply for tuition assistance for 2013-14 are required to apply to Fulcrum as a first step. The Application is available on-line at http://www.fulcrumfoundation.org/tuition . Paper copies of your completed on-line application must be delivered to Jennifer MacDonald at Holy Rosary School by **January 31, 2013**

Online Application Procedure

- 1. Make a copy of page 1 and 2 of your 2011 Federal IRS 1040, 1040A, or E-file printout for the financially responsible parent(s) or guardian(s). Note: 2011 W-2 forms are not acceptable. Do not send originals. If you do not have 1040 documentation, have your school principal approve a letter of special circumstances (see Part D-3 of the application). Be sure to sign your tax forms. This is often overlooked, especially with E-filing. Fulcrum will not accept un-signed forms.
- 2. If you have Non-Taxable Income (Part C-3), copy the applicable documents such as 1099, federal or state aid, alimony or child support.
- 3. Under 'School,' select Holy Rosary, Seattle and enter your information in Part A to D. A printout is produced at the end of the submission process. If you discover an error after submission, submit a new application and destroy the incorrect printout. Please do not enter names in ALL CAPS.
- 4. Sign the online printout in Part E.
- 5. Staple the signed application, in front of copies of the financial documents from step 2 and 3.
- 6. Make a copy for your records, if desired. Copies will not be returned by the Fulcrum Foundation.
- 7. Deliver or mail the complete application package to Jennifer at Holy Rosary School by January 31, 2013.
- 8. If you have students in both elementary and high school, you will need to complete the elementary (K-8) and high school (9-12) application forms. These grants are awarded separately by the Fulcrum Foundation.

BASE: Please remember to complete and submit monthly calendars by the 25th day of the prior month. Monthly calendars are available on the school website. We will be charging a late fee of \$25 beginning in February for calendars turned in after the 25th day of the prior month. We are also requiring you to have a BASE EFT Form on file. You have the option of automatic withdrawal from your banking account via EFT, or charges

to your credit card. Transactions will occur on/around the 15th of each month. The BASE EFT Form is available on the school website.
