This week, I would like to conclude a two-part series that focuses on our marvelous Kindergarten program. As I mentioned last week, I have been so impressed by our Kindergarten program, especially the ladies who have put so much of their talent, energy and love into our program. So here is the conclusion of my recent conversation I had with two of Holy Rosary's finest! This week the focus is on KB.

Mrs. Crockett and Mrs. Everett, Kindergarten-B

How long have each of you worked at Holy Rosary and how long have you worked together?

Mrs. Crockett: I have worked at Holy Rosary for 13 years. This is my second year working with Mrs. Everett. As a parent, I came to Holy Rosary School in 1993 when our oldest daughter started in second grade. Our fourth child will finish here in 2016, which gives Matt and I 23 consecutive years of parenting at Holy Rosary School! That must be some kind of a record!

Mrs. Everett: This is my tenth year working in Kindergarten at Holy Rosary School. I was fortunate to have Mrs. Crockett as my daughter's kindergarten teacher at Holy Rosary and I was the room parent that year.

What do you like best about working with kindergarteners?

Mrs. C: The opportunity to witness their sheer delight and enthusiasm in the whole kindergarten experience with everything new and exciting!

Mrs. E: They are so enthusiastic about everything, they are so honest and they keep you in the moment. They have such individual personalities and I so enjoy getting to know each and everyone of the children. It is amazing how much they grow and learn throughout the year.

How do you manage all those little angels?

Mrs. C: I manage my class with clear expectations, gentle reminders, and lots of praise and enthusiasm for positive steps in the right direction.

Mrs. E: I worked in pre-school for ten years before my position here at HR so I am very familiar with little ones. Mrs. Crockett does an excellent job of teaching class rules and I support and reinforce them.

How has the kindergarten curriculum developed over the years?

Mrs. C: I have recently returned to kindergarten after teaching other grades. My previous experience was in a half-day program where students learned their letters and sounds. Now we are teaching high frequency words and the students now attend all-day. It is a big change, but the children are doing well.

What are some of the highlights each year?

Mrs. C: Star of the Week; 8th Grade Buddies; chanting and reading the Christmas Program; getting to know the specialist teachers. My highlight as a teacher is watching the students grow into a caring classroom family throughout the year. When they graduate, they are kind and respectful students, ready for the new experiences awaiting them in 1st grade!

Mrs. E: I love the first day of school! The holidays are also always fun especially the Christmas Program. I would also add, Catholic Schools Week and Kindergarten Graduation.

Why do you think Holy Rosary is such a special school?

Mrs. C: Our students are surrounded by people who genuinely care about them. They always act with the individual child's best interest in mind. The staff does everything they can to set the students up for success and infuse kindness and Christian values at every opportunity.

Mrs., E: I love the sense of community at Holy Rosary. The parents and students become like family. We also have an excellent staff. Being able to integrate faith and spirituality into the curriculum is very important to me.

I hope you have enjoyed this two-part series as much as I have preparing it. I love to turn the attention to our faculty and staff who do such an incredible job with your children. Holy Rosary School is truly blessed to have such community within the Holy Rosary Parish.

Deadline for Fulcrum Tuition Assistance Application approaching. School families intending to apply for tuition assistance for 2013-14 are required to apply to Fulcrum as a first step. The Application is available on-line at http://www.fulcrumfoundation.org/tuition . Paper copies of your completed on-line application must be delivered to Jennifer MacDonald at Holy Rosary School by **January 31, 2013**

Online Application Procedure

- 1. Make a copy of page 1 and 2 of your 2011 Federal IRS 1040, 1040A, or E-file printout for the financially responsible parent(s) or guardian(s). Note: 2011 W-2 forms are not acceptable. Do not send originals. If you do not have 1040 documentation, have your school principal approve a letter of special circumstances (see Part D-3 of the application). Be sure to sign your tax forms. This is often overlooked, especially with E-filing. Fulcrum will not accept un-signed forms.
- 2. If you have Non-Taxable Income (Part C-3), copy the applicable documents such as 1099, federal or state aid, alimony or child support.
- 3. Under 'School,' select Holy Rosary, Seattle and enter your information in Part A to D. A printout is produced at the end of the submission process. If you discover an error after submission, submit a new application and destroy the incorrect printout. Please do not enter names in ALL CAPS.
- 4. Sign the online printout in Part E.
- 5. Staple the signed application, in front of copies of the financial documents from step 2 and 3.
- 6. Make a copy for your records, if desired. Copies will not be returned by the Fulcrum Foundation.
- 7. Deliver or mail the complete application package to Jennifer at Holy Rosary School by January 31, 2013.
- 8. If you have students in both elementary and high school, you will need to complete the elementary (K-8) and high school (9-12) application forms. These grants are awarded separately by the Fulcrum Foundation.
