Dear Families,

As I have previously shared, our faculty is hard at work to re-align our Math and Language Arts curriculum maps to match the new Common Core standards. I would like to share some very exciting news. The next generation of Science standards is currently in development and will be published later this year. As with Language Arts and Math, the new standards will place emphasis on core concepts and will align themselves to performance expectations and concrete measurement. Holy Rosary School will engage in studying these standards as soon as they are published.

Earlier this year, I enrolled our school in the National Science Teachers Association. Among other benefits, this brings our school into contact with the latest trends and developments in the area of Science instruction. Professional journals are critically important in any profession, this is true as much in Education as it is in Medicine. With our membership, we receive two levels of journals, one primarily aimed at K-5 and the other 6-8. We will also take advantage of periodic webinars directed toward teacher development in the Sciences. Last year, I started a curriculum committee strand studying our overall Science curriculum. There is great enthusiasm among the faculty in this area. This committee group will be very beneficial to us as we move forward and bring the topics into general faculty discussions and planning. I am sending two of our teachers, Mrs. Helling and Mr. Schreck, to the Puget Sound Educational Service District for a presentation on the new Science standards. I am putting together a fact-finding team to visit the West Seattle STEM school. What we learn, we will bring back into our building. I am sending Mr. Ritscher to a renowned regional Science Convention next month to provide him with an opportunity to enrich his teaching, which by the way, I think is excellent already!

Where does Holy Rosary stand as of last spring according to the Iowa Test of Basic Skills compared to the national averages? Based upon national averages, Holy Rosary students are in the upper end of the spectrum. I am so proud of our students and the wonderful teachers that have achieved these results. The other significant factor in our achievement is our parent community here at Holy Rosary and the importance you place on education and in honoring our teachers. My aim is to ensure that Holy Rosary School grows beyond the excellence we already enjoy to an even higher place that provides for your children in all their educational needs.
