A Word From Fr. John FROM PLAYING TO PRAYING AND FROM PRAYING TO PLAYING! AND BACK AGAIN.

On Tuesday morning I was working out on the exercise equipment at the gym in front of a collection of TV sets ---- the only place I get to watch any TV during Lent! On the two TV's directly in front of me, one carried replays of segments of recent college basketball games particularly Gonzaga and the other screen was showing the procession of Cardinals into the Vatican to begin the process of voting for the next Pope. The whole row of TVs had one or other of these scenarios and I thought about what this meant in our lives as I looked back and forth between the screens. There is play time and prayer time in our lives and many things in-between. The people of India have a saying that compares a human being with a house that has four rooms: they are the physical, mental, emotional and spiritual and they contend that to be a complete human being we have to keep each room well aired out. This means that we need to spend some time in each room otherwise the building will be unbalanced.

As I watched parts of the basketball games there were scenes from all phases of that event from coaches pep talks and directives to the kids racing up and down the court and making shots from a variety of positions on the court. There was also the inevitable scenes of ecstatic joy and great frustration and sorrow. It's all part of the game.

On the other screen I watched Cardinals filing in to the Sistine Chapel singing the Litany of the Saints ---- connecting to a long tradition of people who have gone before them on this journey and asking their intercession, and then singing the prayer to the Holy Spirit asking the guidance of the Spirit of God on what they were about to do.

Both scenes were so different from each other as to be surreal as I continued my exercise yet both have a significant place in our lives as a Catholic people. The questions it brings up for me is: what influences our lives and how do we allow them to be shaped. What gives us our identity as a Christian Catholic people of God. To

spend all of our available time on either one or the other extreme wouldn't make for a balanced life or identity. If we want an identity that includes faith, hope, love, forgiveness, kindness and compassion so that these are demonstrated on the playing field for fun or for a livelihood we need to gather in and sing and pray as the Cardinals did.

I am hoping for Gonzaga to finally crack the Final Four --- what an achievement that would be ---- yet I am praying even more attentively that the newly elected Pope will be divinely inspired to be the leader we as a church in the world need at this time in our troubled history when there are so many more people ---- including Catholics --who are watching the sports channel than ever watch the religion channel. What we watch consistently will shape our identity the most and even if we identify as Catholic that identity will limp badly like an injured player who has to leave the game because he can't continue.

Keep both screens going but do watch the one that helps shape your spiritual identity!

The School Commission met on March 7th for our monthly meeting. During the meeting, we recognized Bruno Tarabochia for all that he does for Holy Rosary. Bruno is a true Jack of all Trades as he regularly moves between keeping the traffic flowing before and after school to running the Bingo at Westfest to officiating CYO sports. Bruno, thank you for your dedication and generosity to Holy Rosary. In addition, we approved the February meeting minutes which can be found here. The first half of the meeting was led by John Vair as he presented the proposed 2013/14 Budget and Tuition that the finance sub-committee recently completed. It was endorsed by the School Commission and I will be presenting this to the parent community at the **Budget and Tuition Presentation** on March 19th at 6:30 in the School Hall. If you are interested, please attend. After the finance discussion, Chris Henggeler gave a summary of the technology inventory that he and Jon Barker did a few weeks ago. This is a big accomplishment and will allow us to better track our technology resources. As mentioned last month, the School Commission approved moving forward with creating a small group consisting of parents, staff, Adcom, and SC members to further analyze the different possibilities for improvements to the

playground. Next steps will include scheduling an open meeting to obtain feedback from the community and forming the small group that will drive progress on this goal. We will communicate the date once it is confirmed.
