#### From Father John

#### **CHANGE — Very Soon!!**

People love change or hate it and there may be some who see the need for it and don't mind it! I guess it depends on whether it benefits us or challenges us: if it benefits, we are usually good with it.

Every year Lent calls for a change in our lives so that we can get the most out of Easter and the most out of our spiritual lives. It directs us to look in our hearts and ask if they are given to God or whether we have a divided allegiance to the passing things of the world.

Change is needed at times in any parish just as the church needs change: Pope Francis has caused a stir with some changes in our time as the Second Vatican Council called for change in the 1960's — a huge change which we have never fully came to grips with.

After some months of review a Liturgy task force has researched how our Sunday Masses have been going: it is easy to see that 5 Masses on the weekend is more than is needed and has recommended that we cut back to 3 Masses.

They kept track of the numbers attending over the past year and clearly recognized that a full church gives a much greater experience of the communal nature of the Mass than a half empty one. I had hoped that the old adage of "build it and they will come" would invite additional parishioners but it seems like we are at the max of those who are into a culture of attending church.

The Archdiocese is addressing the distribution of available priests and has asked parishes to limit the number of Masses that are not needed so that priests can be spread around to meet other needs. It makes sense.

Beginning with the Memorial Weekend — May 24/25 — I am accepting the recommendation to go to the following schedule of Masses:

Saturday 5 pm: Sunday 8.30 and 10.30 am.

That will mean eliminating both the 11.30 am and 5 pm on Sunday. The report from the Liturgy Commission will be in the parish bulletin on the Easter weekend.

#### THE SCHOOL FAMILY IMPACT.

The so-called two tier tuition scale has been around for many years: it provided a lower cost to in-parish active, practicing Catholics. This has long ago ceased to work as an attractive incentive and now I have the proposal before me in the "White Paper" that we go to one cost for everyone: that cost would be closer to the actual cost of educating a child in an excellent school that has shown excellent results over a long period of time. I would much prefer not to have to take this step and I am giving this at least one more year before I make the final decision.

#### WHAT THIS MEANS:

If you are claiming in parish tuition at this time I would love to keep you there if you are ready and willing to reopen the gift of Faith and reestablish a culture of church attendance and involvement in your family --- starting right away. I truly hope you will and here is what I am proposing to help make that possible.

THE GREATEST UNOPENED GIFT in the lives of many parents and children is the gift of an active faith life connected to a church community. Many conversations over the seven and a half years I have been here have convinced me that while our school is a very attractive option, the faith connection isn't as attractive mostly because some parents did not grow up in a church going environment, or dropped it early and never really got into is as adults or there is no real interest in church going among some families or priests and church just don't do it for your faith life.

#### **POSSIBLE SOLUTIONS!**

- 1. I have arranged for a very dynamic speaker on three Monday evenings: April 28; May 5 and May 19 to present for one hour each night 7—8 pm in church on opening up the Catholic Life to you as an adult spouse and parent. Tom Curran is a husband and father of a sizable family who gives presentations all over the country. He will speak at the weekend Mass on April 26/27 so you can hear him in advance at your regular Sunday Mass. Child care will be provided.
- 2. If your church and priest are the problem for you, just add us to your regular daily prayers: pray for God's plan for all of us to be who he wants us to be and experience what prayer can do, first hand.
- 3. If for some reason you can't get to Mass on a particular weekend: ski lessons in winter; a hike in Summer; baseball or soccer tournaments on the road come to Mass Friday morning before you go or Monday morning after you get back or find a Catholic Church on the road: I find them in every part of the world! Bring back a bulletin so we can see how we compare with them! Tell me if the priest came out before Mass and welcomed you!


4. Sign up for a ministry: the ministry of hospitality is a big need and the newest version of it will be traffic directors who will be needed to direct people to parking places especially the parking in our school yard so as to make the most out of every available parking space — until we build a new parking arrangement!!!

The recently formed parish Leadership Group has just finalized our new vision statement:

"Renew our Holy Rosary community in union with Jesus Christ by evangelizing through spirituality, service and fellowship."

This signals a change that invites all of us to reopen the Greatest Unopened Gift: our Catholic Faith. All new families to the school along with First Grade and Seventh Grade families received a blue sheet in their registration package that needs to be signed by me. It indicates that you meet the expectations for in parish tuition. If I have not received that I am assuming you are in the out of parish status beginning this July. It is not too late to get that in to me if you forgot it. You can pick one up at the school office or the parish office. I feel I have to be an honest steward of the limited financial resources the parish has when I give them out to help lower tuition. I am genuinely looking forward to visiting with as many families as I can from every grade in the upcoming weeks to discuss and clarify what I have written and invite you to open the gift of active faith. I am praying that you will give me a call or drop me an email so we can get together ---- the week after Easter Sunday would be great if you are in town.

## **School Commission Openings**

The Holy Rosary School Commission has 3 openings for at-large members. Terms for this position are four years and start in the 2014-15 school year. This is an opportunity to provide a voice for all Holy Rosary parents, and to be a leader in your school community. School Commission is an advisory group that works with the principal and pastor on policy-related issues. Examples of ongoing issues on which the School Commission collaborates are the school budget, including fundraising, health and wellness, technology, and the school's strategic plan. The School Commission does not make decisions that affect day-to-day operations of the school. It also does not make decisions regarding academic curricula – that is the responsibility of the principal and his staff. The entire committee meets once monthly (typically on the first Thursday of every month during the school year) and each member serves on one or two subcommittees. Subcommittee work is done outside of the regular meeting.
